Hello everyone -

Frank and I very much appreciated the discussion this morning. Here is some immediate follow-up:

1) Park "Project Review" for April 3

I was just able to reserve a presentation slot for the next regularly scheduled session - <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>3 April</u> from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm (specific time slot TBD). The location is the conference room almost directly opposite from Frank's office suite, where we met earlier today. This would typically involve a 20-minute presentation (with the dreaded A/V stuff, handouts, etc) to the park staff responsible for NEPA and historic preservation compliance. As Frank mentioned, this is also the usual way concepts are discussed for reaction by senior park staff. Rich and his colleagues at Fort Mason Center are very familiar with how this works.

Veronica, I will be creating a a placeholder entry on our web-based "PEPC" (pronounced like Coke's archrival) environmental project compliance system on Monday, and I will arrange for you to get project sponsor access/edit privileges so you can upload documents and related in advance of the April 3 meeting - - - more to follow on that subject in a direct email from me.

2) Special event permit

If it's going to happen...we would likely issue a "special event permit" for this, in parallel with some type of license or similar agreement you would have with Fort Mason Center. You can get sample event applications and permits through the park's web site:

Description: A San Francisco Bay Area-based technology company proposes to temporarily moor a custom-manufactured vessel between historic Piers 1 and 2 at lower Fort Mason, for a period up to five (5) months in cooperation with NPS and Fort Mason Center (FMC) - May through September 2013 (including setup and breakdown - open to public for approximately three months). They may not be moored in the space consistently the entire time.

The barge will be used to host a variety of public and private sessions and events demonstrating emerging technologies and applications applicable to government, nonprofit, and commercial use. The proposer hopes to activate public use of waterfront mooring adjacent to the historic Pier 2 shed for its traditional intended purpose. It will also integrate and expand the existing cultural and recreational uses of Fort Mason Center.

The vessel on which the exhibit space will be constructed is a four year old, 260'L x 72'W x 16'H steel deck barge in very good condition. The expected draw of the barge will be 6' with the deck at 10' above the waterline when normally loaded.

The exhibit space atop the vessel will be built using repurposed shipping containers to construct a 13,726 square foot exhibit space. The external dimensions of the exhibit space are 160'4" long, 40' wide and 50' high. The maximum anticipated number of guests on board at any one time will be 150; including staff. The vessel is designed to be able to operate independently if necessary without needing resources (electrical, water, etc.) from the pier.

The barge requires temporary mooring facilities and at least two "gangway" style connections to the pedestrian apron at Pier 2. Proposer will be coordinating access with the FMC rehabilitation project of the Pier 2 shed.

Barge will be moored using one of two technical options now under consideration. Option 1 is the preferred option.

1. Moor to pier. We are researching with FMC and engineering consultants (retained by proposer) if the pier can sustain the weight of the barge alongside it - we have been provided by NPS various design and construction documents related to the rehabilitation of the Pier 2 sub-structure circa 2002-2006. Under this option, we would bring in "yokohama style" rubber fenders to place between barge and pier pilings to protect the composite (plastic) pilings so they are not scuffed/worn by the barge resting right against the pilings. If FMC and NPS would like us to leave the rubber fenders in place after our departure, we would be able to do so as a legacy improvement to the pier area - this may assist in accommodating future short-term mooring in that location.

 Spud the barge. With this option we would drive spuds (large metal pipes) deep into the bottom to immobilize barge, approximately 10 feet off the pier. We are confirming that this typical practice should not require any BCDC permits.

While the fundamental purpose of the barge exhibit space is to showcase technology, there are substantial public benefits:

Following up our conversation today...here's a collection of public record "environmental" docs relating to Fort Mason Center that give you a flavor of BCDC and NPS views on environmental compliance (NEPA is our federal counterpart of CEQA).

I pulled these from old PEPC entries - these all relate to FMC's initial lease with NPS, and the subsequent long-suffering plans to rehab the Pier 2 shed. I haven't been able to turn up any environmental documentation yet on the the NPS-funded-and-constructed rehab of the Pier 2 substructure. However, here is a BCDC-related memo in the construction set I sent over yesterday - I didn't look closely, but there may be some type of reference to a BCDC project number or "consistency determination" number or file that you could track back using BCDC record sources...





Barge will be moored using large metal pipes, known as spuds, enchored to the ground to immobilize the barge, approximately 10 feet off the pier. The primary benefit of spudding rather than mooring the barge to the pier and pilings is that it avoids structural loading of the historic piers. Hello Team Google -

Thank you joining us this past Wednesday morning for our "project review" session - the presentation was useful and appreciated. It typically takes two weeks or so for official notes, follow-up questions, and conditions to go out from our park NEPA staff to presenters and proposers, but I thought it best to summarize my impressions and highlight some issues that you can potentially address quickly, perhaps in memo form, in order to accelerate the preparation of responses:

1) SPUDS and BCDC

Could you provide moree detailed description/sketch of how spuds would be utilized - affixed to what points of the barge, how many, etc. Typical depth into the bay mud. I have attached another drawing (PDF) I stumbled upon with circa January 2011 depth soundings in the location (part of concept planning and background for potential new Alcatraz ferry embarkation points) - not sure if this was also contained in one of the other technical documents I forwarded earlier.

[I believe I still owe you some effort to gin up Pier 3 documents - will look Monday...]

Could you provide some type of confirming memo regarding your specific understanding of how BCDC and/or Army Corps of Engineers, or other typical shoreline/harbor regulatory authorities deal with spud deployment over the expected duration of the event.

Sketch showing in 2-D the location of the barge re: Pier 2, where the spuds would likely be, and the likely gangway (2) connections over to the Pier 2 apron - this would probably end up serving as some type of permit site plan for NPS purposes...also some Google marine engineering statement on likely effect of pile driving spuds on integrity of adjacent pier substructure?

2) ADA

You may know that the park has been in recent litigation involving accessibility. Could you address in a simple memo, perhaps with sketch or photos, how accessibility is addressed, perhaps with FMC involvement, in terms of nearest accessible parking, the paths to the gangways, and then to what extent the vessel structure/exhibit area will be accessible, whether by USCG standards for public vessels (?) or your own corporate standards or similar. We have a park accessibility coordinator interested in this.

3) Visitor number confirmations

Hello everyone -

Frank and I very much appreciated the discussion this morning. Here is some immediate follow-up:

1) Park 'Project Review" for April 3

I was just able to reserve a presentation slot for the next regularly scheduled session - Wednesday, 3 April from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm (specific time slot TBD). The location is the conference room almost directly opposite from Frank's office suite, where we met earlier today. This would typically involve a 20-minute presentation (with the dreaded A/V stuff, handouts, etc) to the park staff responsible for NEPA and historic preservation compliance. As Frank mentioned, this is also the usual way concepts are discussed for reaction by senior park staff. Rich and his colleagues at Fort Mason Center are very familiar with how this works.

Veronica, I will be creating a a placeholder entry on our web-based "PEPC" (pronounced like Coke's archrival) environmental project compliance system on Monday, and I will arrange for you to get project sponsor access/edit privileges so you can upload documents and related in advance of the April 3 meeting - - - more to follow on that subject in a direct email from me.

2) Special event permit

If it's going to happen...we would likely issue a "special event permit" for this, in parallel with some type of license or similar agreement you would have with Fort Mason Center. You can get sample event applications and permits through the park's web site:

There are fee schedules, etc and other docs that help walk through the permitting process, all of which would be customized somewhat and which would start officially at the time you made the project review presentation on April 3. 








EXISTING CONDITIONS - FORT MASON





2. SCOPING

Discussion:

- Although NPS is supportive of the concept of providing safe pedestrian and bicycle access, based on the site visit by NPS staff, and the site information presented at Project Review, both areas (Caltrans ROW, and NPS property) have resource challenges that make trail placement difficult. Challenges mentioned include: wetlands, Caltrans ROW, construction costs, wildlife habitat, and Easkoot Creek floodplain.
- Daphne Hatch said that the park cooperated with Caltrans to build a berm along Easkoot
 Creek in order to minimize flooding on Hwy 1. In addition, this area could be potential
 jurisdictional wetland, floodplain, and have resource habitat values. Due to physical
 properties of the area, NR staff need to be involved in the planning process.
- Mr. Sutton said the community portion of the trail could be done in the next couple of
 months and he acknowledges the NPS may not be able to resolve the site challenges for
 this portion of the trail on the same timeline as the rest of the project.

INTRODUCTION

This memorandum documents the results of visual-only observations and rapid structural conditions assessments of the Fort Baker Pier and Fort Mason Piers 1, 2, and 3. Described herein are general conditions, areas of significant damage and deterioration, and comparisons of observations with the most recent assessments. The purpose of this work is to determine if the findings of the previous assessments remain valid or if additional structural analysis is needed to inform planning-level estimates of probable construction costs. It should be noted that no underwater observations were performed.

FORT BAKER PIER

ORIGINAL CONSTRUCTION

The original construction of the pier has the following elements:

- approximate overall dimensions: 29 feet by 358 feet
 - approach pier: 29 feet by 238 feet; main pier: 114 feet by 120 feet
- deck area: 20,582 square feet
 - area of approach pier: 6,902 square feet; area of main pier: 13,680 square feet
- · length of bulkhead wall: 29 feet
- number of concrete piles: 308
- perimeter length of fendering (all sides): 914 feet
 - approach pier: 476 feet; main pier: 438 feet
- · current use: public fishing pier

The current configuration of the concrete pier (Photograph 1) was constructed between 1937 and 1940 as a mine depot structure for the harbor defenses of San Francisco. Original plans show overall dimensions but do not include dimensions of the structural sections, details of reinforcing, or information on material specifications (USACE 1937).

The structural deck is constructed of cast-in-place concrete and is topped with an asphalt wearing surface. The concrete deck is supported by plumb, pre-cast concrete piles, and lateral support to the pier is provided by rows of similar battered piles at the northeast, southeast, and southwest sides.

PREVIOUS REPAIRS

No evidence was noted of substantial repairs performed since the pier was originally constructed.

PREVIOUS CONDITION ASSESSMENT

In 1998, Marine Design Associates, Inc. (MDA), reported only minor pile damage (Level 2) below water. On average, the above-water portion of the piles was described to be moderately damaged (Level 3). The assessment used the numerical damage rating system presented in Table 1.

OBSERVATION METHODS

A rapid, qualitative structural observation was performed by Anchor QEA. L.P., and our subconsultant KPFF Consulting Engineers, Inc. (KPFF), to evaluate visual deterioration and signs of damage above the waterline. Under-pier work was performed from a small skiff provided by the National Park Service. Visual assessments of each pile were made using the numerical damage rating system presented in Table 1. Observations were performed on February 2, 2012, during a falling tide that ranged from 3.4 to 0.6 feet above mean lower low water (MLLW).

OBSERVATIONS AND COMPARISONS TO PREVIOUS ASSESSMENTS

Deck/Soffit

The deck appears to be in generally good condition considering its age; however, much of the deck soffit (underside) is covered with a black membrane that hindered observation. Several areas of poorly consolidated concrete (honeycombing) were noticed (Photograph 2). The deck has an asphalt topping that is cracked in many places, and this cracking is especially evident at the structural joint where the approach pier meets the main portion of the pier. As in 1998, the mooring hardware appears weathered but functional.

Concrete Piles

The portions of the pre-cast concrete piles that were visible above the waterline show significant damage, including large cracks (Photograph 2), rust stains, and exposed reinforcing bars in many places. The typical pile now has moderate to major damage (Level 3.5; see Table 1) compared to average moderate damage (Level 3) observed in 1998. The battered piles, which provide lateral support to the pier, have worsened to a condition of moderate to major damage (Level 3.5) compared to the minor damage (Level 2) observed in 1998. The piles near the bulkhead are especially damaged, with many exposed reinforcing bars (Photograph 3).

Bulkhead

The bulkhead shows minor cracking with a few exposed reinforcing bars, while some spalling and a few holes were also observed. Gaps exist under the wingwall located south of the bulkhead, and the upland paving is slightly settled just behind it.

Timber Fender Piles

The timber fender piles are badly decayed. One whole section on the northeast side hangs loosely from a few rusty bolts (Photograph 4). Near-term removal of this section, or installation of a warning sign, should be considered. Most other fender piles are severely decayed near the waterline.

Other

Guardrails are intact. An abandoned pipe is present under the deck on the southwest side of the approach pier.

REPAIR RECOMMENDATIONS

Based on the observed conditions, substantial repairs would be required if this pier is to be used for future ferry loading or to support a floating breakwater. Cost estimates for use of this site are being prepared under separate project tasks. Costs will include estimates of probable construction costs for the following potential repairs:

Deck/soffit

- resurface or replace the cracked asphalt topping
- clean and remove the soffit membrane to allow for inspection
- patch damaged areas of the deck edge and soffit

Concrete piles

- clean piles above and below the waterline for inspection and remove debris and loose concrete prior to repair
- potentially excavate material adjacent to the piles to allow repair access
- repair (splice) reinforcing bars at heavily damaged piles
- repair damaged concrete by crack injection, hand-patching, or forming/pouring as necessary
- wrap piles with fiber-reinforced polymer fabric and/or inject with epoxy as necessary

Bulkhead

- repair damage to concrete and reinforcing bars
- seal gaps at the bottom of the bulkhead
- fill any voids found behind the bulkhead
- reinforce bulkhead (e.g., tiebacks) if necessary

Timber fender piles

- remove all fender piles
- replace fender pile system where necessary for potential future uses

Other

- replace guardrails for compliance with current codes
- remove the abandoned pipe and support brackets
- install new utilities as needed

FORT MASON PIER 1 (WEST PIER)

ORIGINAL CONSTRUCTION

The original construction of the pier has the following elements:

- · approximate overall dimensions: 81 feet by 504 feet
- deck area: 40,824 square feet
- · length of bulkhead wall: 81 feet
- number of caissons: 135
- perimeter length of fendering: 1,089 feet (three sides)
- current use: two-story warehouse (public access to building and pier is restricted)

Fort Mason Piers 1, 2, and 3 (Photograph 5) were constructed between 1910 and 1915. Original plans for the substructure of these piers are not known to exist. The pier construction is a cast-in-place concrete deck (with an asphalt topping) supported by concrete caissons. Each concrete caisson is a 4-foot-diameter reinforced concrete column with an enlarged concrete base. In some locations, this base is supported by timber piles. Four angled haunches are present at the top of each concrete caisson. These haunches are located just below the deck soffit and are aligned with the rows of caissons.

PREVIOUS REPAIRS

Repairs made at several caissons in 1950 include full and partial concrete encasement with one caisson replaced by a grouping of steel pipe piles (USACE 1950). Additional caisson repairs were designed in 1993 (MNE 1992a, 1992b; Photographs 6 and 7).

CONDITION ASSESSMENT

A report published in 1999 noted that the damage was slightly worse than in 1992 (MNE 1999). The 1992 report noted that the average numerical damage rating of the caissons was minor to moderate damage (Level 2.5; MNE 1992c). The numerical damage rating system used was similar to the system that was used at the Fort Baker Pier (previously described). The majority of the caissons had spalled about 2 inches between the high tide and low tide elevations, and typical spalling, flaking, and pitting were reported.


OBSERVATION METHODS

The observation method for the Fort Mason Piers was similar to the methods used at Fort Baker. Observations were performed by Anchor QEA and KPFF on February 3, 2012, during a falling tide ranging from approximately 5.8 to 0.2 feet above MLLW.

OBSERVATIONS AND COMPARISONS TO PREVIOUS ASSESSMENTS

Deck/Soffit

Approximately 67 to 75 percent of the deck soffit area is damaged with spalled concrete and exposed, corroded reinforcing bars (Photograph 8). In some areas, the reinforcing bars have completely rusted through. The northern half of the pier shows more deck soffit damage than the southern half. Approximately 10 percent of the deck soffit damage extends into the beams (thickened deck sections) between caissons. In some cases, this damage extends to the embedded structural steel within the concrete beams (Photograph 9). The entire exposed perimeter edge of the concrete deck has severe weathering damage with exposed and heavily corroded reinforcing bars (Photograph 10). The asphalt topping shows extensive cracking with vegetation growing in the cracks.

Caissons

The average concrete caisson has moderate to major damage (Level 3.5; see Table 1) for the portions that could be observed above the waterline. The damage increases slightly to the north and west sides of the pier. As previously mentioned, in 1992 the average caisson had minor to moderate damage (Level 2.5). The caissons have evident spalling, especially near the waterline. Some of this spalling appears to be due to original poorly consolidated concrete (i.e., honeycombing).

At many locations, cracking and/or rust is visible at the typical construction joint located just above the high tide line. Several of the caissons have haunches with exposed reinforcing bars visible (Photograph 11). At one location, the caisson was replaced with a group of concrete-filled, steel pipe piles. These pipes are severely corroded (Photograph 12).

Bulkhead

The bulkhead (seawall) has minor cracking. Water staining near the top of the wall indicates prolonged water seepage. The nearby deck beam has exposed reinforcing bars (Photograph 13). No weep holes were observed in the wall.

Timber Fender Piles

There are almost no fender piles at the west side. A few remnant fender piles are visible below the waterline. The timber fender piles at the north and east sides are severely decayed and are mostly severed near the waterline. The grouping of timber fender piles at the northeast corner is missing.

REPAIR RECOMMENDATIONS

Based on the observed conditions, substantial repairs (similar to the 2004 Pier 2 repairs described below) could be required if this pier is to be used for future ferry loading. Cost estimates for use of this pier are being prepared under separate project tasks. Costs will include estimates of probable construction costs for the following potential repairs:

Deck/soffit

- resurface or replace the cracked asphalt topping as necessary
- completely remove and replace the exposed concrete deck edge girder
- repair spalling concrete and the damaged reinforcing bars at the deck soffit

Caissons

- clean loose material prior to jacketing with polymer fabric
- repair (splice) reinforcing bars at heavily damaged piles
- inject new concrete into polymer jacket
- repair concrete at caisson haunch and apply fiber reinforced polymer
- remove mud from around caissons to enable inspection and repair
- replace damaged pipe piles and pile cap

Bulkhead

- repair minor cracking at the wall face
- repair exposed reinforcing bars at the top of the wall similar to the exterior deck edge girder
- fill voids behind the bulkhead if necessary
- reinforce the bulkhead if necessary

Timber fender piles

- completely remove the timber fender piles and related timber framing
- completely replace with composite (fiberglass-reinforced plastic) fender piles, similar to the Pier 2 repairs

· Other

- install guardrails
- remove the abandoned pipe and support brackets
- install new utilities

FORT MASON PIER 2 (MIDDLE PIER)

ORIGINAL CONSTRUCTION

The construction of Pier 2 is similar to that of Pier 1. The original construction of the pier has the following elements:

- · approximate overall dimensions: 118 feet by 652 feet
- deck area: 76,936 square feet
- · length of bulkhead wall: 118 feet
- number of caissons: 245
- perimeter length of fendering: 1,422 feet (three sides)
- current use: herbst pavilion (event space) and cowell theater

FORMER REPAIRS

Caisson repairs are shown on as-built drawings from 1950 (USACE 1950) and, similar to Pier 1, caisson repairs were designed in 1993 (MNE 1992a, 1992b). A significant seismic upgrade (URS 2002), described below, was performed in 2004 (Photograph 14).

PREVIOUS CONDITION ASSESSMENT

In 1992, the average numerical damage rating of the caissons was minor damage (Level 2; see Table 1). Minor spalling was reported on most of the caissons.

OBSERVATION METHODS

The observation of this pier was outside the scope of our work, and thus, only very cursory observations were made.

OBSERVATIONS

Fort Mason Pier 2 was extensively repaired and seismically upgraded in 2004. Considering that these recent repairs may serve as a benchmark for future repairs to Piers 1 and 3, several items are of particular interest:

- In 1992, caissons were reportedly in slightly better condition than those in Piers 1 and 3.
- All visible surfaces of the caissons (up to the deck soffit) were repaired.
- A new composite (fiberglass-reinforced plastic) fender pile system was installed at all sides of the pier to match the configuration and appearance of the old timber pile system.

FORT MASON PIER 3 (EAST PIER)

ORIGINAL CONSTRUCTION

The construction of Pier 3 is similar to that of Pier 1. The original construction of the pier has the following elements:

- approximate overall dimensions: 652 feet by 155 feet
- · deck area: 90,870 square feet
- · length of bulkhead wall: 287 feet (L-shaped)
- number of caissons: 280
- perimeter length of fendering: 1,328 feet (three sides)
- current use: festival pavilion (event space)

PREVIOUS REPAIRS

The observed previous repairs were similar to those observed at Pier 1 except that several caissons were replaced by groupings of steel pipe piles (Photograph 15).

PREVIOUS CONDITION ASSESSMENT

According to MDA, the average numerical damage rating of the caissons in 1992 was minor to moderate damage (Level 2.5; see Table 1). The damage reported was similar to that of Pier 1.

OBSERVATION METHODS

The observation method for the Fort Mason Piers was similar to the methods used at Fort Baker. Observations were performed by Anchor QEA and KPFF on February 3, 2012, during a falling tide ranging from approximately 5.8 to 0.2 feet above MLLW.

OBSERVATIONS AND COMPARISONS TO PREVIOUS ASSESSMENTS

Deck/Soffit

The condition of the deck is similar to that of Pier 1 except that the west area (approximately half) is more damaged than the east area. Approximately 75 percent of the western area and 25 percent of the eastern area requires repair. In several locations, miscellaneous concrete frames, walls, and tanks are suspended from the deck soffit. More widespread cracking and delamination were noted in the northeast corner. More exposed structural steel beams were observed at Pier 3 than at Pier 1, especially along the western edge. Near the bulkhead corner, the concrete beam (thickened slab) shows extensive spalling and corrosion of the reinforcing bars (Photograph 16). The asphalt topping is worn, but it has much less cracking than Pier 1.

Bulkhead

This bulkhead wall is L-shaped and, therefore, significantly longer that the other piers. Some spalling was observed at the vertical wall joints. Near the low tide line, waves were observed flowing into (and out of) a small hole. In another location, water was observed seeping through the wall at a horizontal joint (Photograph 17), which may be indicative of a water leak behind the wall. Moving water can lead

to migration of soil particles, creation of subsurface voids, and subsequent loss of support for paving behind the wall.

Caissons

The average concrete caisson has moderate damage (Level 3; see Table 1) observable above the waterline. The damage increases slightly to the north and east sides of the pier. As previously mentioned, in 1992 the average caisson had minor to moderate damage (Level 2.5). Where caissons were replaced with groupings of steel pipe piles, the pipes are severely corroded. One caisson at the west end of the north side of the pier is completely cracked through and is rated as severely damaged (Level 5). In its current condition, this caisson does not provide any significant lateral support to the pier (Photograph 18).

Timber Fender Piles

Similar to Pier 1, the timber fender piles are severely damaged and missing in many places, especially at the west side. The pile group at the northwest corner is mostly gone, and at the northeast corner, it is missing entirely. One fender pile on the west side has fallen away from the pier and is leaning out into the waterway (Photograph 19).

OTHER

A guardrail was installed on this pier, but it is heavily damaged or missing in several places.

Repair Recommendations

Based on the observed conditions, substantial repairs would be required if this pier is to be used for future ferry loading or to support a floating breakwater. Cost estimates for use of this pier are being prepared under separate project tasks. Costs will include estimates of probable construction costs for the following potential repairs:

Deck/soffit

- resurface or replace the cracked asphalt topping as necessary
- completely remove and replace the exposed concrete deck edge girder
- repair spalling concrete and the damaged reinforcing bars at the deck soffit

Caissons

- clean loose material prior to jacketing with polymer fabric
- repair (splice) reinforcing bars at heavily damaged piles
- inject new concrete into polymer jacket

- repair concrete at caisson haunch and apply fiber reinforced polymer
- remove mud from around caissons to enable inspection and repair
- replace damaged pipe piles and pile cap

Bulkhead

- repair minor cracking at the wall face
- repair exposed reinforcing bars at the top of the wall similar to the exterior deck edge girder
- fill voids behind the bulkhead if necessary
- reinforce the bulkhead if necessary

Timber fender piles

- completely remove the timber fender piles and related timber framing
- completely replace with composite (fiberglass-reinforced plastic) fender piles, similar to the Pier 2 repairs

Other

- install guardrails
- remove the abandoned pipe and support brackets
- install new utilities

CONCLUSIONS

The findings of the previous assessments remain valid (MDA 1998; MNE 1999); however, recent observations show that conditions continue to worsen. The piles supporting the Fort Baker Pier have worsened from showing moderate damage to exhibiting some major damage. The caisson damage rating for Fort Mason Pier 1 has worsened from minor/moderate to moderate/major damage. The caisson damage rating for Fort Mason Pier 3 has worsened from minor/moderate to moderate damage. All of the piers are repairable.

This memorandum and the previous assessment reports provide adequate data for preliminary planning-level cost estimating; however, further assessments (such as detailed corrosion mapping and underwater inspection), which may reveal potential additional required repairs, should be performed as part of more detailed future site design.

LIMITATIONS

The rapid structural conditions assessment provided herein is limited to visual observations made above the waterline for areas waterside of the bulkhead walls. The condition of the piles/caissons

below the waterline is unknown at this time. An underwater dive inspection would be required to evaluate the conditions between the mudline and the waterline.

This memorandum is intended to report the general conditions of the piers at the time the work was performed. Techniques used and information gathered during the performance of the work are not intended to be used to quantitatively estimate the rate of deterioration or remaining service life or to evaluate the current or future load capacity of the piers.

The following elements were not reviewed:

- upland features
- buildings
- utilities
- lighting
- safety equipment (e.g., throw rings and safety ladders).

2. ADA Compliance

We reviewed our ADA plans and are pleased to confirm that the studio complies with all applicable requirements of the ADA.

Specific details of ADA compliance are:

- Parking and Path of Travel from parking lot to the studio
- To minimize gangway slope, we:
 - Fabricated three 6' wide gangways (20', 30', and 40' long)
 - Built two 8'x8' platforms that are adjustable in height, from 2' to 6' above grade
- Access to Studio Levels
 - The Barge Level, three elevated levels, and a partial roof deck are accessible by a continuous ramp that has been designed to ADA standards
- Public Spaces
 - All public spaces on the vessel are designed to ADA standards, including passageways, restrooms, furniture, and millwork.
- Project Emergency Systems
 - Fire alarm systems have both audible and strobe functions
 - Emergency exit signs are provided throughout egress path of travel
 - A Public Announcement system managed from the vessel's command center

3. Visitor Details

While we are flexible with regards to number of visitors, our current plan is for 1,500 visitors per day. We haven't made any decisions on public vs. private use as it will depend on interest from local NGO partners and the allotted amount of time we can use the facility. I would imagine we would use the facility once or twice per week for nonprofits, but are certainly flexible on that piece.

We are also committed to utilizing a scheduling system, if NPS and Fort Mason desire, to manage crowd control.





2. SCOPING

Stinson Beach Safety and Nature Path, Marin County, PEPC 45747, James Sutton from the Stinson Beach Community

Discussion:

- Although NPS is supportive of the concept of providing safe pedestrian and bicycle access, based on the site visit by NPS staff, and the site information presented at Project Review, both areas (Caltrans ROW, and NPS property) have resource challenges that make trail placement difficult. Challenges mentioned include: wetlands, Caltrans ROW, construction costs, wildlife habitat, and Easkoot Creek floodplain.
- Daphne Hatch said that the park cooperated with Caltrans to build a berm along Easkoot Creek in order to minimize flooding on Hwy 1. In addition, this area could be potential jurisdictional wetland, floodplain, and have resource habitat values. Due to physical properties of the area, NR staff need to be involved in the planning process.
- Mr. Sutton said the community portion of the trail could be done in the next couple of
 months and he acknowledges the NPS may not be able to resolve the site challenges for
 this portion of the trail on the same timeline as the rest of the project.
- Both NPS and Mr. Sutton recommend investigating whether the Caltrans culvert is functioning properly.
- <u>5x</u>: The proposed plan does not affect any historic properties, including archeological features.

5X RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Once the project design is finalized, the project should return for 5x compliance review, either as an Admin Review or full review, with a likely assessment of effects as No Historic Properties to be Affected.

PROJECT RECOMMENDATIONS

The Executive Committee understands the community concern regarding the unsafe path of travel along Hwy 1 for pedestrians and the NPS supports the concept of providing a safer pedestrian travel way. The NPS will assign staff to provide a brief assessment of the

proposed action and alternatives to meet the objective of providing safer pedestrian access through this corridor. This concept will be presented at Project Review and further decisions will be made at that time, based on priority, costs and staff capacity. General Superintendent's Comments:

Discussion

- Jordan Reeser (acting Fire Management Officer FMO) provided an assessment of past mowing practices at RCDT that reflects input from NPS and Marin County fire professional that were present at a site visit Jordan conducted in interface areas bordering GGNRA. . Jordan's assessment needs refinement, but will become the basis of WUI actions in the FMP update.
- Kevin Cochary asked about other areas of Rancho Corral De Tierra (aka "Rancho") and adjacent POST properties, specifically POST's Gregerson property and asked whether Jordan had recommendations for these areas. Jordan was not familiar with area in question, but the updated FMP would address the need for fire management actions in this area.
- The community has become accustomed to having fuel management actions done along WUI areas at Rancho. It is important the FMP update actively engage this community.
- There were questions regarding required follow-up actions required of the FMP. Jordan suggests these requirements be revisited and changed if necessary so that these required actions become aligned with park staff capabilities and budget.
- There was discussion on the planning process to be followed, and the scope of what to be considered for the FMP update. Proposed fuel management actions should be developed at the same level as the current FMP, including habitat assessment, public engagement, and regulatory requirements. An IDT planning process should be followed, and organized with the Fire team interfacing with the San Mateo Team.
- <u>5x</u>: There was a request to have the current Fire Management Plan available to park staff on the Fort Mason Common Drive, or other comparably accessible location. [Update: The

FMP FEIS and ROD are accessible on PEPC as project 13822 and on the FOMA Common directory/Fire Management Plan, and Public PEPC]

<u>5x</u>: A clarification was made that what is being presented is an update for an operational manual called the Fire Management Plan. One component of that FMP should be a 5-year Fire Management Plan but with uncertain funding and staffing it became infeasible to develop and implement a meaningful 5-year plan.

• <u>5x</u>: If a 5-year Fire Management Plan is developed in the future, it will need to follow review guidelines identified in the GOGA Fire Management Plan Programmatic Agreement set in place with the SHPO in 2005, particularly in regards to providing opportunities for public, SHPO and tribal community review, but that is not the subject of this Project Review.

5X RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. PM will work with CR team to review the obligations in the programmatic agreement; determining which conditions require follow-up, and which should be pursued for modification or deletion due to staff capabilities and budget.
- 2. The final draft of the Fire Management Plan Update should return for 5x compliance review.

PROJECT RECOMMENDATIONS

The Executive Committee supports this planning process to go forward, as this is a necessary management component for new lands in San Mateo not previously covered in the existing FMP. The Executive Committee makes the following recommendations for Co-Project Managers Wendy Poinsot and Christine Carey on moving this planning effort forward:

- 1. Jordan Reeser (Network FMO) will refine the Rancho fire management actions for both general wildland fire and fuels management for the Rancho property, giving special emphasis on WUI actions (or lack thereof) for Montara, Moss Beach, and El Granada communities and may be added to the scope of the FMP update. Jordan is requested to prepare a summary of his assessment for distribution to the public, and also present at a public meeting in coordination with Christine Carey.
- 2. Jordan will coordinate with CalFire and Coastside County Fire District on our FMP update and proposed interim Rancho actions, and provide them the opportunity for review and comment, with the objective of having all agencies speak with the same voice as to the effectiveness of treatments.
- 3. Wendy Poinsot, working with the network fire professionals, and interfacing with the GGNRA San Mateo Team, will conduct an IDT planning process to update the GGNRA Fire Management Plan. Wendy Poinsot will work with Steve Ortega to plan out the environmental compliance approach and determine the NEPA pathway.
- 4. Wendy Poinsot, working with Christine Carey (San Mateo Team Coordinator), will suggest an IDT and present at Project Management Group (PMG) for discussion and refinement.





Project Descriptions - April 3, 2013 Project Review

Special Exhibition and Education Hall Vessel To Moor at Lower Fort Mason Pier 2, PEPC 46674





Stinson Beach Safety and Nature Path, Marin County, PEPC 45747

Stinson Beach community member James Sutton presented a proposal to develop a Safety and Nature Education Path along the southwest side of State Route 1 (Hwy 1) where it brings visitors through Stinson Beach (from Calle del Mar to Calle del Arroyo). The total distance of the trail is approximately 1,500 feet, of which approximately 450 feet of the proposed trail is located on land owned by GGNRA. The community members are seeking permission from GGNRA to build the path on NPS property where the park's property line is adjacent to the Hwy 1 ROW.

The existing undeveloped pedestrian path sits along the western margin of Highway 1 and gets heavy use by residents and visitors especially on weekends. It is considered unsafe because it is so close to traffic, and difficult to negotiate. In order to improve the pedestrian safety, community members are proposing to design, construct and maintain a walking path that provides a safety buffer away from highway traffic. Pedestrians currently using the undeveloped path are walkers, some pushing baby strollers and wheelchairs, and bicycle riders, directly adjacent to this highly trafficked thoroughfare that is overwhelmed on weekends. Community members want to address this dangerous situation by developing a path that formalizes a trail away from moving traffic.

The path would run from a few feet to a couple of yards off the Highway pavement, be approximately 4-5 feet wide and have wood runners that border both sides of the path. The excavated area between the runners would have fabric covered with gravel, sand and road-base and will be compacted to create a walking and riding surface to accommodate pedestrian and bike traffic. The surface would also allow access to people with mobility challenges. Some of the areas where the path would be located on GGNRA land are seasonally wet due, in part, to the presence of a culvert feeding the area with runoff from upslope, across the road. The culvert is in Caltrans jurisdiction. The community is willing to work with NPS for design solutions in these areas.

Fire Management Plan Update and Amendment to include Newly Acquired GGNRA Lands PEPC 46704

Wendy Poinsot, Environmental Planner with the network Fire Program, and Jordan Reeser, the network's Acting Fire Management Officer, presented a proposal to update the GGNRA Fire Management Plan (FMP). All NPS units with FMPs are required to conduct a thorough update and review every five years to:

- 1. Ensure regulatory compliance adequately covers changed conditions such as newly identified resources, changed legal status of resources, changed regulatory requirements, etc.
- 2. Update FMP content to reflect any changes in federal wildland fire management policy, and
- 3. Expand the scope of the FMP to include newly acquired lands with burnable vegetation.

The GGNRA FMP Update planning process will amend the FMP and compliance record to include Rancho Corral de Tierra and other new lands. An amendment requires that these lands be assessed for fire hazard, be assigned fire management unit (FMU) designations, and that potential suppression, fire prevention, fire education and communication, fire ecology and fuels management strategies be identified. An important component of the Update will be the development of a public education and information program to address concerns along the park interface with residential areas primarily in Montara, Moss Beach and El Granada.

The scoping process for the FMP Update will assess whether changes to the existing FMP and/or the record of environmental compliance for the pre-2006 park units in Marin, San Francisco and San Mateo counties are needed. Internal and public and agency scoping should consider whether changes are needed to the document and environmental compliance record including changes to:

- FMP goals and objectives,
- FMU zoning designations,
- Project Areas identified for resource benefit and fuels management actions,
- The environmental conditions in areas covered by the current FMP, and
- Mitigation measures

It is being proposed that the FMP be amended to address long-term fire management planning for the newly acquired lands after the completion of the GMP planning process. Fire management actions proposed for Rancho would be reassessed when the long-term resource management and recreation strategy is finalized and the GGNRA GMP/EIS is finalized.

Dear Mr. Goldzband:

On _______, 2013 Golden Gate National Recreation Area ("GGNRA"), a unit within the National Park Service ("NPS"), authorized By and Large, LLC ("BAL"), a non-federal entity, to temporarily berth its Studio, an approximately 3,120 square-foot barge with exhibit space to showcase technology, adjacent to Pier 3 at Fort Mason. BAL's use of the area has been developed in conjunction with the Fort Mason Center, which is also a non-federal entity. Prior to authorizing, we considered whether the project was consistent with applicable federal laws. For Coastal Zone Management Act (CZMA) consistency, the NPS considered whether the project, an "unlisted activity" for federal consistency review purposes, was anticipated to have reasonably foreseeable effects on the State of California's coastal uses or resources (see analysis below), as required under CZMA (16 U.S.C. § 1456; 15 C.F.R § 930.54). The NPS concluded that the Studio would not impact public access or coastal resources within the coastal zone, and therefore, the authorization was not subject to federal consistency review. Federal lands are exempt from the definition of "coastal zone" under the CZMA (16 U.S.C. § 1453(1)).

If the San Francisco Bay Conservation and Development Commission ("BCDC") wishes to review this activity then a request for approval to review may be made within thirty (30) days to the Director of Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management with notice also given to the NPS, and BAL. 15 C.F.R. §930.54. The NPS would like to reiterate that "[t]he unlisted activity procedures in [section 930.54] are provided to ensure that State agencies are afforded an opportunity to review federal license or permit activities with reasonably foreseeable coastal effects." Id. (emphasis added). As the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration ("NOAA") guidance explains, consistency review must be based on coastal effects and "[c]onsistency does not apply to every action or authorization of a Federal agency, or a non-federal applicant for federal authorizations." The NPS does not believe that federal consistency review is triggered by this project.

No Reasonably Foreseeable Coastal Effects

In accordance with the BCDC Bay Plan (Reprinted March 2012), the NPS has determined that the Studio adjacent to Pier 3 at Fort Mason will not impact public access or coastal resources and therefore, does not require a consistency determination.

Fort Mason is located in the center of San Francisco's northern waterfront. BAL has developed the Studio program in partnership with the GGNRA under Special Use Permit [____] ("GGNRA SUP"). The Studio exhibit has been designed to showcase digital technology in a manner that draws the public to the waterfront, is educational of the current and past maritime history of Fort Mason, and uniquely evokes public interest in the juxtaposition of modern and historic technology, architecture, art and maritime use at Fort Mason.

<u>Public Access</u> – The Studio does not affect public access at Fort Mason. The location of the Studio at Pier 3 does not prevent the public from accessing areas normally open to the public. BAL worked closely with the GGNRA and Fort Mason Center to be sure that users of the Studio will arrive and depart in a manner that is consistent with existing circulation patterns so as not to impact visitor flow. The Studio has been reviewed and approved by the GGNRA and Fort Mason Center for accessibility and impact on the cultural and natural resources of Fort Mason, and found to pose minimal impacts to such resources.

<u>Coastal Resources</u> – The Studio is a temporary use of the permitted area at Fort Mason. It will float at all stages of the tide, is not expected to emit levels of noise or light greater than exists currently, and is otherwise not expected to result in adverse environmental effects. The term of the GGNRA SUP is 60 days, after which time the Studio would leave Fort Mason.

The National Park Service has determined that the Studio does not affect public access and coastal resources at Fort Mason, San Francisco. If you need additional information or if you have any questions, please do not hesitate to call Steve Ortega of my staff at 415-561-2841.

That led to the meeting on March 22 (in Fort Mason Bldg 201 - Supt's office) with FMC and Google, and the subsequent project review presentation on April 4. The barge requires temporary mooring facilities and at least two "gangway" style connections to the pedestrian apron at Pier 3. (b) (4) Proposer to work with FMC to prepare appropriate emergency plan for all public safety providers. Proposer to review universal accessibility standards for vessels and report to FMC and NPS.

Vessel will be moored using large metal pipes, known as spuds, anchored to the ground to immobilize the barge, approximately 10 feet off the pier. The primary benefit of spudding rather than mooring the barge to the pier and pilings is that it avoids structural loading of the historic piers. Applicant's research has

indicated that this is a common practice in the bay and doesn't require BCDC permits for temporary use. Spuds were used in the construction project during the upgrade of Pier 2 and will have no long term impact on the structural integrity or historic features of Pier 3. Applicant may transport some quests via water taxi and offload them on the water side of the barge. This allows visitors to appreciate the pier and historic waterfront from a different perspective.
