The Associated Press (AP) sponsored exhibit “American Presidents” is at Federal Hall National Memorial through November 2012.



The famous Ron Edwards photo of the attempt on President Reagan’s life is included in this exhibit, in addition to many familiar, heart-warming and even surprising images of the President at work and play.
