



## 'harlem is... DOWNTOWN'

Join us for 'harlem is... DOWNTOWN', a multi-level exhibit at Federal Hall celebrating Harlem's identity as a crucible for African-American arts, culture and community activism.

This exhibit, presented in partnership with Community Works, offers an artistic understanding of multiple cultures within American society from Lower Manhattan to Harlem, documenting Americans of African descents' activism, theatrical contributions, musically and through dance, by presenting original artwork and performances.

The centerpiece will be a 30-foot timeline that traces Harlem's cultural roots, to be displayed in the Rotunda.

Exhibits on the Lower Level will explore Harlem's rich traditions in music and theater. The Balcony Level will highlight the work of artists in dance through photographs and the words of New York City school students. The work of children's author and illustrator Bryan Collier, plus work by Harlem schoolchildren, will appear on the Upper Level.

Profiles of 30 statesmen, artists and other activists will also be featured. Short films on Harlem's history will begin at 11 A.M., 1 P.M. and 3 P.M.

Admission is free.
