

Labor Day Program September 7th, 2015

Labor Day, the first Monday in September, is a creation of the Labor Movement and is dedicated to the social and economic achievements of American workers. It constitutes a yearly national tribute to the contributions workers have made to the strength, prosperity, and well-being of our country.

In the 19th century, the port of New York was the primary port of entry for goods reaching the United States, and as such the Custom House in New York was the most important in the country.

Thus, the Customs Service, especially in the early years of the nation, proved the truth of that profound maxim: “the revenue of the state is the state.”
