Fire Island Treks

Fire Island National Seashore is hosting:

— The *Fire Island Trek*

* September 5-7, 2012

- * The Fire Island Trek is approximately a **20 mile hike** on sand and boardwalk beginning at the Wilderness Visitor Center and ending at the Fire Island Lighthouse.
- * Limited logistical support is available, but you must provide for your own transportation and pay for your own meals along the way. You will need to provide your own sleeping bag for overnight stays.
- * There is a \$100.00 fee for lodging and logistical support.

* June 29, 2012

- * The Summer Twilight Trek is approximately a **13 mile hike** on sand and boardwalk beginning at the Wilderness Visitor Center and ending at Cherry Grove. A ferry back to Sayville, NY is available from Cherry Grove.
- * You must provide and pay for your own transportation and parking, and bring a bag lunch for along the way.

* September 22, 2012

- * The Fall Twilight Trek is approximately a **9 mile hike** on sand and boardwalk beginning at the Fire Island Pines and ending at the Fire Island Lighthouse. You must make arrangements to be picked up at Robert Moses State Park, Field #5.
- * You must provide and pay for your own transportation and parking, and bring a bag lunch for along the way.

Explore Your National Seashore.

One of only ten National Seashores in the country, Fire Island is truly a unique place. 32 miles long, this barrier island is home to a wilderness area, various barrier island habitats including salt marshes and maritime forest, 17 individual communities, and historical maritime icons like the Fire Island Lighthouse.
