Administration

The National Park Service (NPS) manages 401 parks and more than 84 million acres of land throughout the entire United States and its territories, from Maine to Guam. Of the over 84 million acres of land, 53 million acres have burnable vegetation.

The NPS is one of five federal land agencies that manage wildland fire. Others within the Department of the Interior are the Bureau of Land Management, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and the Bureau of Indian Affairs. The U.S. Forest Service resides within the Department of Agriculture. Like the NPS, all have portions of total acreages that are burnable thereby requiring fire management.

In times of need, NPS fire management resources are shared with federal, state, tribal, local and non-governmental partners.

Resources

NPS fire management includes hand crews, wildland fire modules, engine and helitack crews, as well as support personnel in parks and regional and national offices. Two Type 1 hotshot crews, Alpine Interagency Hotshot Crew (IHC) and Arrowhead IHC are based at Rocky Mountain National Park and Sequoia & Kings Canyon National Parks, respectively.

Wildland fire modules mainly support NPS and interagency prescribed fire activities and wildfire incidents. The NPS has six active modules -

- Black Hills at Jewel Cave NM (SD)
- Buffalo National River (AR)
- Cumberland Gap NHP (KY)
- Great Smoky Mountains NP (TN)
- Saguaro National Park (AZ)
- Whiskeytown NRA (CA)

Equipment

The NPS manages an inventory of wildland fire funded equipment, strategically located throughout the United States, to assist in fire management activities.
