The Museum is located in Florissant, across the street from the Post Office. She will guide children in discovering the nuggets of historical and personal information available on the historical granite markers throughout this 1874 cemetery.

Mueller State Park

Aspen Nature Hike 10/4/2008, 10:00 AM Grouse Mountain Trailhead

Enjoy the golden splendor of the aspen trees as they ready themselves for the cold winter ahead. Join the Volunteer Naturalist for a nature hike in search of the most colorful displays. The 2.0-mile trail is rated moderate. Wear hiking shoes; bring water, sunscreen and a snack.

Enjoy a leisurely hike on Preachers Hollow Trail to experience the breath-taking beauty of fall with the Park Naturalist. This 2-mile loop, rated moderate, features a scenic aspen and montane meadow trail. Bring water and wear hiking shoes.

Who Lives Here? 10:00AM – Meet at the Trailhead Parking Lot.

Want to hold a cougar skull, wiggle a deer's loose tooth or stick your hand in a black bear's mouth? How do coyotes dress for winter, and why don't deer freeze? Maybe you have some cool questions about the animals that live here. We'll touch and explore the wildlife at our Skins and Skulls table then head out with our binoculars to watch some extreme behavior in the prairie dog colony.

Trail Savvy – How Observant Are You? 1:00PM – Meet at the Visitor Center.

Learn how NOT to miss all the really cool stuff on the trail. We'll train you in some techniques that will make you a fantastic nature observer. Use your skills to snap a super digital picture with a park camera that you can take home.
