Step by Step [2] – Fort Davis NHS provides educational programs to more than 5,000 school children per year, and the historic site employed 10 local high school students through the 2014 Youth Conservation Corps program.

History Lesson [3] – In 2014, Fort Davis NHS completed more than 10 major living history activities and participated with more than 10 community events.


Live and Learn [16] – In 2014, Fort Davis conducted over 20 on-site education programs for school groups and provided remote access (on line) to multiple education programs.
