The mission of the Leopold Education Project is to create an ecologically literate citizenry so that each individual might develop a personal land ethic. Aldo Leopold foresaw and articulated one of the largest problems facing humankind –how do we maintain a sense of connection to the natural systems that support us? The Leopold Education Project strives to counteract this landless feeling and to instill a land ethic among tomorrow's stewards. LEP does this through an interdisciplinary approach of reading about Leopold's recorded discoveries and participating in meaningful "hands on" activities, which provide students an opportunity to increase their appreciation for the land and to expand their ecological awareness.


### June 30; 9am –3pm Project Learning Tree Workshop at Fort Heiman National Battlefield
