The TRT program is a national program that links National Park Service sites to today's classrooms by bringing teachers into the parks to work for the summer and bring their subject matter expertise and educational training to park programs. In exchange, teachers return to the classroom with a new set of experiences to share with their students.

TRT at Fort Smith

The historic site is recruiting one (1) elementary grade level (K-6) teacher to assist in the development of education programs that connect the park's history and significance with elementary audiences. The TRT recruit will:

- Evaluate and make recommendations for improving existing children's programming.
- Develop new lesson plans with resource materials connecting elementary audiences to the park's main stories.
- Develop a teacher workshop focused on helping elementary teachers bring the park into their classrooms.

- A \$3,000 lump sum stipend pending completion of 160 work hours
- Teacher-Ranger-Teacher shirt and hat provided
- Opportunity to earn graduate education credit through the University of Colorado Denver. *Additional requirements apply.*
- One position is available for the summer of 2013.
- Teacher works 160 hours over 4 to 8 weeks between June and August, 2013
