

Come celebrate National Park Week from Sunday, April 16 through Saturday, April 24, 2011 at the Ford's Theatre National Historic Site. Park rangers and volunteers will present interpretive talks about the life, assassination, and legacy of President Abraham Lincoln. On selected dates and times during the week, rangers and volunteers will dress in period clothing, (19th century) as they present interpretive moments in the theatre and museum. Please note that the Petersen House is currently closed for renovation.



While on site, visitors are encouraged to learn more about national and local parks/sites dedicated to interpreting the legacy of President Abraham Lincoln.
