
Camping Rules and Regulations (Continued)

There is no waste water disposal, dirty or black water, at Floyd Bennett Field camp.

Visitors to campsite occupants are allowed from 8 a.m. – 10 p.m.

Campers are required to possess a valid entrance pass and receipt from their reservation. The reservation receipt must be posted on the dash of their automobile parked in the designated area.

Campground Limits

6 occupants per site, including children

One reservation per family.

Transfer of site from one party to another is prohibited.

All tenting and canopies are to be secured to the ground and not to trees.

2 small or 1 large tent per campsite

Length of stay is limited to 7 days, from April through October, and an additional 30 days the remainder of the year.

Permit holder must be 18 years of age or older and must be present at all times. Park staff reserves the right to check ID of the permit holder.

Campers must check in by 9:00 pm or risk losing their reservation.

Campsites are considered vacant if left unoccupied for 24 hours. Refunds will not be given.

Camping Rules and Regulations (Continued)

Vehicle Parking

ALL Vehicles, including trailers, must be kept on designated parking areas, not on vegetation.

Transportation of campers and their equipment by motorized boats is prohibited.

Overflow parking is available on large parking area adjacent to Hanger B

2 vehicles per site (including motorhomes and all types of trailers) or 4 motorcycles, not on the vegetation.

Tents and camping equipment must be placed within 20' of the grill in each designated campsite and every attempt should be made to occupy space designated for your own camping area.

Food Storage and Sanitation

Food must be stored in a vehicle or hard-sided container. **Feeding wildlife is strictly prohibited.**

There is no disposal facility for Black Water and RV campers must make arrangements for disposal outside of the Floyd Bennett Field Camping Area.

Do not leave trash unattended. Dispose of trash in dumpsters or designated cans only. Put recyclables in marked containers. Leave campsites free of litter.

Do not throw trash into toilets since it causes damage to pumping equipment.

Camping Etiquette

Quiet Hours are from 10 p.m. – 8 a.m.

Responsible use of alcohol is allowed, but intoxicated campers under the influence can and will be evicted from the camping area.

Campers should check their site for damage issues prior to setting their equipment. Campsites will be checked upon checkout of the camper and Gateway reserves the right to assess additional fees to campers for any damage at the site.

Camp and park only in designated areas

Do not move picnic tables

Generator use at RV sites only and use is allowed only from 8 – 10 a.m., and 6 – 8 p.m.
