
Camping Rules and Regulations

Reservations and Check In

Campers must obtain a permit and parking pass at the Ranger Station, which is open from 9 a.m. – 4 p.m. Parking pass must be displayed on the vehicle dashboard. Late arrival is after 4 p.m. Your reservation will be forfeited, if we do not hear from you within 24 hours of your scheduled arrival date. If you are going to be delayed, call (718) 338 – 3799, from 9 a.m. – 5 p.m. to let us know.

Re-sale or auction of Advanced Reservations is prohibited. Advance reservations made through the national reservation service may not be advertised, or offered for sale, or auction.

Campsites

Tents and camping equipment must be placed as far from the grill as possible, within in each designated campsite. Please only occupy only the space designated for your camping area.

Campfires must be in fire rings only, and must not exceed 3 feet in height. No ground fires are permitted. Charcoal grills are not permitted. Propane canisters are restricted to one, 3 pound canister per campsite.

Food Storage and Sanitation

Food must be stored in a vehicle or hard-sided container. **Feeding wildlife is strictly prohibited.**

There is no disposal facility for black water. RV campers must make arrangements for disposal outside of Floyd Bennett Field.

Do not leave trash unattended. Dispose of trash in designated cans only. Put recyclables in marked containers. Leave campsites free of litter.

Camping Rules and Regulations (Continued)

Do not throw trash into toilets since it causes damage to pumping equipment.

Vehicle Parking

ALL Vehicles, including trailers, must be kept on designated parking areas, not on vegetation.

Transportation of campers and their equipment by motorized boats is prohibited. Boat launching from trailers is prohibited.

Overflow parking is available on large parking area adjacent to Hanger B. There is a 2 vehicle per site (including motorhomes and all types of trailers,) or 4 motorcycles. Do not park on the grass, or on any vegetation. There are no hookups for motorhomes.

Camping Etiquette

Quiet Hours are from 10 p.m. – 8 a.m.

Responsible use of alcohol is allowed, but intoxicated campers under the influence can and will be evicted from the camping area.

Campers should check their site for damage issues prior to setting their equipment. Campsites will be checked upon checkout of the camper and Gateway reserves the right to assess additional fees to campers for any damage at the site.

Please, do not move picnic tables

Generator use at RV sites only and use is allowed only from 8 – 10 a.m., and 6 – 8 p.m.

Check Out is by 11 a.m. on the last day shown on your camping permit.




Enjoying Your Camping Experience
