

Things to do in and around the park

Biking/Hiking

The Rockaway Gateway Greenway, a paved multi-use pathway that offers a unique way to see the park and the city. Maps available at the Ryan Visitor Center.

Fishing

Access to bay and ocean front fishing areas. The park permits surf fishing at all beaches except when lifeguards are on duty. A free New York State Saltwater Fishing Registration is required.

History

Ranger -led and self-guided tours and programs available.

Historic Aircraft Restoration Project (HARP)

This program, located in Hangar B, Floyd Bennett Field, is located adjacent to campsites open Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday 9am-4pm; Sunday 2pm-4pm.

Hiking

Various sites, such as Dead Horse Bay and North Forty Natural Trail.

Archery

Open-air range . Arrows with practice tips only. Crossbows prohibited. Handicapped accessible. Permit required; included with camping reservation.

Kayaking/Sailing/Canoeing

Free kayaking programs available summer weekends.

Swimming available at Jacob Riis Park—Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day

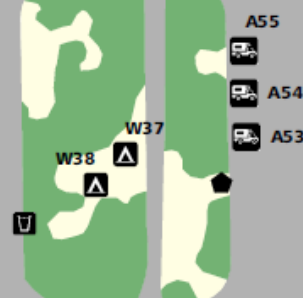

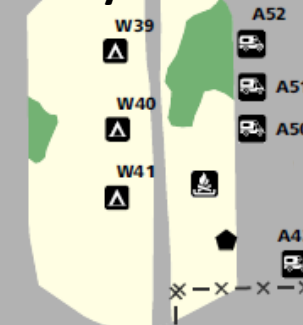

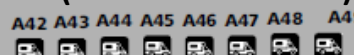

Camping Rules and Regulations

- Reservations are for overnight camping only. Tent and camping equipment required at check in.
- Glass containers, alcoholic beverages and pets are prohibited in the campground. 36 CFR 1.5
- Only 6 people and 2 temporary structures are permitted per campsite (e.g. tent or screen shelter). CFR 2.10 (a)
- Resale, auction, or transfer of campsite reservations is prohibited. 36 CFR 2.3
- Leaving property unattended more than 24 hours is prohibited. 36 CFR 2.22(a)(2)
- Do not leave trash unattended. All trash must be removed from the campsite and placed in the dumpster. 36 CFR 2.14
- Food must be stored properly away from wildlife. Food cannot be unattended. 36 CFR 2.10 (d)
- Fires are only permitted within the campfire ring. 36 CFR 2.13 (a) (1)
- Fires must always be attended and put out completely with water when not attended. Do not let them smolder. 36 CFR 2.13 (a) (4), 36 CFR 2.13 (b)
- Firewood must be purchased at check-in. Collecting firewood in the park is not permitted. No outside wood is permitted. 36 CFR 1.5
- Tying or stringing hammocks, clothesline's or tarps to trees is prohibited. 36 CFR 2.1 (a)
- Children under 18: Reservations at this facility require an adult (18 and older) be present onsite
