




Site 10: Runway 6-24

N 40° 36' 14.50"

W 40° 53' 4.86"



In 1941, The United States Navy purchased Floyd Bennett Field and made many extensive additions including housing, offices, hangars, runways and aprons. This runway was built in 1942 - 1943 and is 300 feet wide and nearly 5800 feet long. Today it is the longest unobstructed runway on Floyd Bennett. Runway numbering corresponds to the degrees on the compass, where the final zero is left off. For example, Runway 6-24 corresponds to 60 degrees and 240 degrees. You are standing on a modern runway marking, the same as you would find in a modern airport. Elsewhere on Floyd Bennett Field, the historic black circles with white numbers are used to indicate the original placement and appearance of the historic 1930's runway markings.
