Piegian Pass Hike
Join a ranger for an unforgettable trip along one of the most spectacular trails in the park. This all-day hike climbs 1750 feet to high alpine views of Piegian Glacier and the Many Glacier valley. Wildflowers abound in this unique geological setting. Upon reaching the pass, hikers will return on the same trail back to Siyeh Bend.
Note: Depending on trail conditions, hikers might have to walk on lingering snow and/or might not be able to reach the pass.

International Peace Park Hike

Cruise scenic Two Medicine Lake and join a ranger for a gentle hike to Upper Two Medicine Lake gaining 350 feet in elevation over 2.2 miles. Pause at Twin Falls and traverse flower-filled meadows on your way to the lake.
