WALKS & HIKES



Autumn Amble

► 2 hours, easy, 1.75-miles (2.8 km)
Fall is a time of change and preparation. Discover what is happening to the forest and its inhabitants during the changing season.
● Lower McDonald Creek Bridge on Camas Road (0.25 miles west of the Apgar Village turnoff)

Avalanche Lake Hike

► 3½ hours, moderate, 5-miles (8 km)
Journey through a majestic old growth forest and relish in the splendors of scenic Avalanche Lake.
● Avalanche Creek roadside parking area on the Going-to-the-Sun Road

Creekside Stroll

► 2¼ hours, easy, 2-miles (3.2 km)
Enjoy a casual stroll through diverse habitats along beautiful lower McDonald Creek.
● Apgar Visitor Center flagpoles

Forests of Lilliput Walk

► 2 hours, easy, 1.5-miles (2.4 km)
Discover the fascinating world of mosses, ferns, lichens, and fungi.
● Make reservations, in person, up to three days in advance at the Apgar Visitor Center.

Johns Lake Loop Hike

► 2 hours, easy, 3-miles (4.8 km)
Explore striking cedar-hemlock forests, quiet lakes, and roaring cascades on this leisurely hike.
● Johns Lake trailhead (1.5 miles north of the Lake McDonald Lodge on the Going-to-the-Sun Road)

Journey to Apgar Lookout

► 5 hours, strenuous, 6.6-miles (10.6 km)
Ascend through an emerging forest to a mountain summit and find inspiration in the breathtaking views from a historic fire tower.
● Apgar Lookout trailhead (Turn on Quarter Circle Bridge Road 0.5 mile north of the West Entrance and continue ~2.5 miles)

Rocky Point Ramble

► 2 hours, moderate 2.25-miles (3.6 km)
Enjoy beautiful views and a diverse landscape as you journey to the shores of Lake McDonald.
● Rocky Point trailhead (0.25 mile north of Fish Creek Campground Kiosk on the Inside North Fork Road)

Sculpting the Landscape Walk

► 2 hours, easy, 2-miles (3.2 km)
Unearth the dynamic forces that build and shape the dramatic scenery in the park.
● Johns Lake trailhead

Stories in Stone Stroll

► 1 hour, easy, .5-mile (.8 km)
Enjoy a brief introduction to the area geology and then stroll the scenic lakeshore to delve deeper into the processes shaping the land.
● Apgar Campground Amphitheater

Under the Conifers Walk

► 2 hours, easy, 2-miles (3.2 km)
Explore the dramatic forest bordering the stunning cascades of upper McDonald Creek.
● Second pullout 0.7 miles north of North Lake McDonald Road on the Going-to-the-Sun Road (2 miles north of Lake McDonald Lodge)

A Walk Through Time

► 1 hour, easy walking tour
Enjoy a historical walking tour and unravel the unique history of the Lake McDonald Lodge and surrounding area.
● Lake McDonald Lodge lakeside entrance

Winged Wonders Bird Walk

► 2 hours, easy, 1.5-mile bird walk (2.4 km)
Locate, identify, and learn about several of Glacier's fascinating residents—the birds. Bring binoculars.
● Make reservations, in person, up to three days in advance at the Apgar Visitor Center.

DROP-IN PROGRAMS



Park rangers will be available during the times listed. Stay for a minute or stay for an hour.

Glacier's Night Sky Viewing

► Anytime between 9:30 pm and 11:30 pm
Join an astronomer-in-the-park and peer into the mysteries of the night sky. Telescope viewing is available. Binoculars encouraged. Dependent on weather and sky conditions.
● Apgar Visitor Center parking lot

Glacier's Solar Viewing

► Anytime between 1:00 pm and 3:30 pm
Drop by and take a unique look at the Earth's closest star viewed safely through a special solar telescope. Dependent on weather and sky conditions. The Logan Pass Star Party is scheduled for September 4.
● Apgar Village Green (located across from the hotels in Apgar Village)

Story Behind the Scenery

► Anytime between 2:00 pm and 3:30 pm
Thrill at amazing views and learn about the natural and cultural history which has shaped the surrounding landscape.
● Second pullout on the Going-to-the-Sun Road 0.4 miles north of Sprague Creek Campground

Sanctuary of Cedars

► Anytime between 3:00 pm and 4:30 pm
Relish in the splendors and diversity of the park's iconic old growth forest.
● Meet 0.25 mile up the Trail of the Cedars' southeast boardwalk. (Avalanche Creek area on the Going-to-the-Sun Road)

WALKS & HIKES

Aster Park Hike

► 4 hours, moderate, 3.8-miles (6 km)
Enjoy an easy hike to Aster Falls and then continue sharply upward 670 feet to Aster Park Overlook where you are rewarded with panoramic views of the Two Medicine Valley.
● *Two Medicine Campstore.*

Cobalt Lake Hike

► 7 hours, strenuous, 11.4-miles (18.3 km)
Walk past waterfalls and through flower-filled meadows to beautiful Cobalt Lake. You will climb 1,400 feet as you hike through a variety of habitats.
● *Meet at the Two Medicine Campstore.*

Firebrand Pass Hike

► 8 hour, strenuous, 9.6-miles (15.4 km)
Learn about fire ecology as we explore the southeast corner of Glacier. The hike climbs 1,800 feet through 4 different life zones to rocky and rugged Firebrand Pass.
● *Mile marker 203, on Highway 2 (pull out six miles west of East Glacier, on the north side of the road)*

Boat Trip and Hike to Dawson Pass

► 7 hours, strenuous, 10.4-miles (16.5 km)
Cruise Two Medicine Lake and join the ranger on a steep and strenuous hike that climbs 2,500 feet through wind-swept alpine country to spectacular views from Dawson Pass.
● *Two Medicine boat dock.*
Purchase boat tickets at the boat dock.
Fee: \$12.50 adults, \$6.25 children ages 4-12, free for ages 3 and younger.

Boat Trip & Hike to No Name Lake

► 6½ hours, moderate, 8.6-miles (13.8 km)
Cruise Two Medicine Lake and join the ranger on a moderately steep, very scenic hike to No Name Lake, hidden deep in the Bighorn Basin. Enjoy the turquoise lake, flower-filled meadows, and pikas among the red rocks below Pumpelly Pillar wall. Return along the lake via the North Shore trail to the campground.
● *Two Medicine boat dock.*
Purchase boat tickets at the boat dock.
Fee: \$12.50 adults, \$6.25 children ages 4-12, free for ages 3 and younger.

Boat Trip & Hike to Upper Two Medicine Lake

► 5 hours, easy, 4.4-miles (7 km)
Cruise scenic Two Medicine Lake and join a ranger for a gentle hike to Upper Two Medicine Lake gaining 350 feet in elevation over 2.2 miles. Pause at Twin Falls and traverse flower-filled meadows on your way to the lake.
● *Two Medicine boat dock.*
Purchase boat tickets at the boat dock.
Fee: \$12.50 adults, \$6.25 children ages 4-12, free for ages 3 and younger.



A Great Disturbance in the Forest Hike

► 3 hours, easy-moderate, 4-miles (6.4 km)

In a forest, not so far away, this 4-mile loop trail will introduce you to autumn-colored meadows and sweeping mountain vistas. But there is also a dark side. Join a ranger to see examples of the destructive forces that help create balance and renew the land. May the forest be with you.

WALKS & HIKES



Highline to Haystack Hike

► 4½ hours, moderate, 7 miles, (11.3 km)

Explore the Highline Trail on a ranger-led hike packed with panoramas of alpine meadows, glacially-sculpted valleys, and soaring peaks. Wildlife thrives in this lofty locale, including bighorn sheep, mountain goats, and marmots. This hike traverses the mountainsides above the Going-to-The-Sun Road, gaining 500 feet of elevation to Haystack Butte. Return on your own or with the ranger to the Logan Pass parking area.

- Meet at the flagpoles along the front sidewalk of Logan Pass Visitor Center.

Highline Trail Hike

► 7-8 hours, strenuous, 11.6-miles, (18.6 km)

Experience the beauty of the high country on an all-day hike along the Garden Wall. Hike the 7.6-mile trail to Granite Park Chalet followed by a steep 2,200-foot descent over the last four miles to end at The Loop. Due to limited parking space, use of the free park shuttle is highly recommended. Not recommended for young children.

- Meet at the Continental Divide sign at Logan Pass.

TALKS



Alpine Fever

► 20 minutes

The evidence of our changing planet surrounds you at Logan Pass. Join a ranger for a short talk, and see for yourself the impact of climate change on Glacier's alpine landscape.

- Meet by the upper level doors of the Logan Pass Visitor Center.

On any hike, both short and long, remember to bring water, sunscreen, a hat, and a snack.

Especially in the Fall, be prepared for a change in the weather and bring extra clothes.

Alpine Touch Table

► Anytime between 2:00 and 3:00 pm

Stop by a touch table anytime between 2:00 and 3:00 to touch the pelts and horns of the animals that call Logan Pass home. Learn about how these animals struggle to adapt to the changing alpine.

- Meet at the lower level of the Logan Pass Visitor Center.

Alpine Rendezvous

► Anytime 10:00 am–11:00 am, and 1:00 pm–2:00 pm

Explore the beauty, diversity, and hardships found in the alpine environment.


- Meet 0.25 mile up the Hidden Lake Trail.
