Updated Regulations Available for Glen Canyon and Rainbow Bridge

Page, AZ – Superintendent Kitty L. Roberts announced today the availability of the 2006 Superintendent’s Compendium for Glen Canyon National Recreation Area and Rainbow Bridge National Monument. The Superintendent’s Compendium establishes designations, closures, permit requirements, and other restrictions within the boundaries of both national park areas.

The updated Superintendent’s Compendium does not contain any new changes to the park’s regulations. Among other things, it maintains the prohibition on cliff jumping or diving within Glen Canyon. Cliff jumping is an extremely dangerous activity and was prohibited in May of 2005.

The Superintendent’s Compendium also continues to require that all visitors camping on the shore of Lake Powell, the San Juan River, the Dirty Devil River, or the Colorado River use a self- contained toilet designed to dispose of human waste. This requirement has proven extremely successful in improving water quality on Lake Powell.

The National Park Service uses the Superintendent’s Compendium to establish regulations to protect park resources, provide for public health and safety, and to avoid conflicts among visitor uses. The Superintendent’s Compendium is updated on an annual basis or more frequently when necessary.
