Glen Canyon Launches Webcams

Page, Ariz. – Glen Canyon National Recreation Area launched today six webcams focused on Lake Powell. The webcams are located at the Wahweap, Stateline, Bullfrog, and Halls Crossing launch ramps; Dangling Rope Marina; and the National Park Service headquarters building in Page, Arizona.

Superintendent Kitty L. Roberts said, “We are very excited to offer these new webcams. Using the webcams, people anywhere in the world will be able to see for themselves current launch ramp and weather conditions on Lake Powell. We hope people will check Glen Canyon’s Web site to find out updated information about the park before their visit.”

The webcams were made possible through a generous donation from ARAMARK Sports and Entertainment Services, as well as grants from the Arizona Game and Fish Department – Boating Access and Sport Fish Restoration Programs (which are funded through the purchase of fishing equipment and motorboat fuels), and the Utah Division of Wildlife Resources – Lake Powell Fisheries Investigations.

The webcams are cameras that take live pictures every 10 minutes and the photos are posted to Glen Canyon National Recreation Area’s Web site. Webcams are among the most popular Web sites at many national parks.
