Local Volunteers Pitch In to Celebrate National Public Lands Day *Glen Canyon Entrance Fees also to be Waived*

Page, AZ – Glen Canyon National Recreation Area will be celebrating National Public Lands Day this year by offering free entry into the park on Saturday, September 30. In addition, volunteers are invited to help remove graffiti from the Glen Canyon Dam Overlook in Page on Saturday, September 23 from 8- 11 am.

National Public Lands Day is the largest annual coast- to- coast, single- day volunteer restoration effort for America’s public lands. Volunteers from around the nation will be pitching in to help accomplish much needed work on public lands. Now in its 13th year, National Public Lands Day gives Americans a chance to give back to the very lands they use to hike, bike, boat, swim, explore, picnic, or just plain relax.

Glen Canyon entrance fees will be waived on Saturday, September 30. Free entrance passes issued that day will be valid for seven days. Camping and boating fees will still apply.

Local volunteers from the Page area are invited to roll up their sleeves and devote their time to help remove graffiti at the Glen Canyon Dam Overlook. Individuals interested in volunteering should plan on meeting at the Glen Canyon Dam Overlook at 8:00 am on Saturday, September 23. Volunteers should wear appropriate clothing and boots and bring work gloves if possible. As a thank- you for their effort, volunteers will receive a coupon to use as a free entry pass into any national park area across the America.
