Public Comment Sought on Integrated Pest Management Plan

Page, Ariz. – Glen Canyon National Recreation Area has initiated an environmental assessment on a park- wide integrated pest management (IPM) plan. IPM is a science- based decision making process that coordinates knowledge of pest biology, the environment, and available technology to prevent unacceptable levels of pest damage by cost- effective means, while posing the least possible risk to people, park resources, and the environment. The proposed action will provide an IPM plan to reduce risks to the public, park resources, and the environment from pests and pest management strategies.

Glen Canyon National Recreation Area is seeking public comments on the issues, concerns or possible alternatives for the planning process and analysis. The environmental assessment will evaluate the potential impacts to the natural, cultural, and human environment as a result of activities related to the proposed plan. The environmental assessment is expected to be available for public review during the summer of 2007.
