Glen Canyon to Host Public Meeting Concerning Zebra Mussels

Page, Ariz. – Glen Canyon National Recreation Area is hosting a public informational meeting for individuals interested in zebra mussels next Thursday, February 8. Currently, Lake Powell and the upper Colorado River are believed to be free of zebra mussels. However, zebra mussels pose a major threat to Lake Powell if they are introduced.

Issues to be addressed in the public informational meeting include:

- What zebra and quagga mussels are and why they pose a risk for Lake Powell.
- Locations and descriptions about current infestations.
- What the National Park Service and its partners are doing to prevent zebra mussels from becoming established in Lake Powell.
- How community members and park visitors can help keep zebra mussels out of Lake Powell.

Staff from Glen Canyon National Recreation Area and the Utah Division of Wildlife Resources will be on hand to answer questions.

Any interested members of the community are invited to attend. The meeting will be held Thursday, February 8, from 5:30 – 7:30 pm in the Navajo Room at the Lake Powell Resort at Wawheap.
