Motorcycle Entrance Fees Changing in 2008

Page, Ariz. – Glen Canyon National Recreation Area is changing its entrance fees for motorcycles. The fee change will go into effect in March 2008.

Motorcycle entrance fees will change from \$7 per rider to \$10 per motorcycle. With this change, motorcycles carrying two riders would be charged \$10; previously they would have been charged \$14. For motorcycles with a single rider, the fee will also be \$10, whereas previously it would have been \$7.

Entrance fees for automobiles are not changing and will remain at \$15 per vehicle for a seven-day pass. Frequent visitors may also purchase a \$30 Glen Canyon Annual Pass, which provides entry to Glen Canyon National Recreation Area for one year from the date of purchase. The America the Beautiful National Parks and Federal Lands Pass can be purchased for \$80, which provides entry to national park sites and other federal recreation locations. Lifetime Interagency Senior passes (for U.S. residents age 62 and over) are \$10. The Interagency Access Pass continues to be free for disabled U.S. residents. Both of these passes also provide entry into national parks and other federal recreation sites.

Entrance fees provide a vital source of revenue to Glen Canyon National Recreation Area. The funds collected from entrance fees stay within the park and are used directly for critical improvements in the services provided to visitors. This year, entrance fee revenues are being used to replace the fish cleaning station at Wahweap Marina, control exotic species, replace the decking on docks at Dangling Rope Marina, and reconstruct the whitewater orientation facility at Lees Ferry.
