




LAUNCH CERTIFICATION PACKET

Your vessel is required to be certified mussel-free prior to launching in Lake Powell.

HERE'S HOW TO CERTIFY:

1. Look through and answer the questions on the other side of this page.



2. (A) If your answers to the questions tell you to get your boat professionally inspected before launching in Lake Powell, you must do so. Call 928-608-6305 to reach an on-call inspector.

(B) If your answers to the questions indicate you are ready to launch, just complete the self certification statement on page 4 of this packet.

3. Be sure to visibly display your MUSSEL FREE certificate through the windshield of your tow vehicle while parked within the recreation area. You must re-certify your vessel with each new visit to Lake Powell.

Violators are punishable by up to six months in jail, a \$5000 fine, and a mandatory court appearance.

WHAT'S THE THREAT?

Zebra and quagga mussels will disrupt the food chain causing a decline in recreational fishing, foul facilities like docks and ramps, encrust boats and clog engines, and litter beaches with sharp smelly shells.

WHAT CAN I DO TO ENSURE I'M NOT PART OF THE PROBLEM?

Zebra and quagga mussels can be spread by your boat, but they cannot live out of water for long periods of time. Simply washing your boat and equipment and allowing them to fully dry is an effective way to reduce the risk of spreading these aquatic hitchhikers. **CLEAN, DRAIN, DRY** your boat every time you leave a body of water.

Quagga and Zebra Mussel-Free Certification Save Time and Self-Certify!

Was your boat and trailer thoroughly washed and allowed to **completely** dry for at least 5 days since you last launched? You must have removed all dirt, plant and animal material, or grit from the boat. You must have drained and flushed all live wells and bilge areas. The boat must be allowed to dry for at least 5 days.

You are ready to launch!
Sign the certificate on page 4 and display it through your windshield at all times while your vehicle and boat trailer are in Glen Canyon.

NO

You are required to get a professional inspection. Violations are punishable by up to six months in jail and a \$5,000.00 fine. Inspection locations are on page 3 of this packet.

But you should apply this simple screening every time you use your boat to protect all your favorite waters!



Mussel Inspection Stations in Glen Canyon

If the flow chart on page 2 of this packet shows that your vessels present a risk to Lake Powell, they must be inspected prior to launch.

Violators face a mandatory court appearance, \$5000 fine, and up to six months in jail.

The Wahweap Inspection Station is located behind the Sinclair gas station.

Antelope Point Inspection Station is located in the Antelope Point Marina Maintenance Dry Storage Yard. Check in at the Entrance Station or Dry Storage Office.

Bullfrog Inspection Station is located across the road from the Sinclair gas station approximately one mile southwest of the Entrance Station.

At Hall's Crossing, check in at the Marina Office on the docks or dial 928-608-6305 to reach an on-call inspector. An inspector will be dispatched to you.

For Hite, check in at the Ranger Station or dial 928-608-6305 to reach the on-call inspector.

Park Rangers that conduct inspections have a big job. They are not always immediately available at the Inspection Stations. Hours for inspections and launching vary by location and season. Please dial 928-608-6305 for inspection and vessel certification attention. A Park Ranger will be dispatched to you.



Invasive Mussel Prevention Program

This Certificate Must Be Visibly Displayed On Your Dashboard

This certificate is not valid at Wahweap, Stateline,
Antelope Point, Halls Crossing, and Bullfrog

MUSSEL FREE

Failure to display this certificate through the windshield of your tow vehicle could result in a mandatory court appearance, up to six months in jail and a **\$5000** fine.

Zebra and Quagga Mussels Pose A Major Threat to Lake Powell!

Mussels in Lake Powell could:

- Disrupt the food chain and fishing
- Foul facilities like docks and ramps
- Encrust boats and clog engines
- Litter beaches with sharp smelly shells
