



For Teachers: Responsibilities during the Rocks on the Move Field Program

In order to conduct a successful program, the assistance of everyone is required. The following is a set of guidelines for each participant.

National Park Service staff will conduct the field program at the Marin Headlands.

Responsibilities:

- To lead the program and conduct educational activities.
- To ensure the program is conducted in a safe manner.
- To provide first level organization, safety, and discipline for the class.
- To ensure that the natural and cultural resources of the Marin Headlands are protected.

The classroom teacher will continue to be classroom teacher at the educational program on-site.

Responsibilities:

- To coordinate class participation and help conduct the program.
- To retain legal responsibility for students while on site.
- To provide ultimate discipline for the class, maintaining control of the students.

Chaperones and other adults will assist the classroom teacher and NPS staff in guiding the student's outdoor learning.

Responsibilities:

- To facilitate the student field investigations.

The students will participate in an outdoor classroom program that enriches their regular, in-school curriculum.

Responsibilities:

- To participate in the program under the direction of the Park staff.
- To follow safety rules.
- To help protect natural and cultural resources in the Park.
