

## Birds at Lands End

Lands End is an important bird habitat. Over 200 species of birds either live year-round or stop seasonally on their migratory paths.

Habitat restoration at Lands End include removing non-native plant species and planting native ones, increasing the diversity of plant species, and creating a better environment for birds.

Among the birds that can be seen at Lands End are the flycatcher, Hutton's vireo, Anna's hummingbird, red crossbill, warbler, Bewick's wren, green tailed towhee, ring-necked duck, black oystercatcher, and pigeon guillemot. Raptors, which are frequently seen perched in a snag overlooking the Sutro Baths, include the osprey, Peregrine falcon, and red-tailed hawk.
