


VESTIGES of Lands End

Wildlife

Lands End is home to a diversity of wildlife including many rare and endangered species. Yet the activities of humans over the past years have adversely affected many of these creatures by changing the ecosystems to which they are adapted.

Many people hope that populations of Peregrine Falcon, California Quail, Great Blue Heron, California Red-Legged Frog, and Bumble Bee Scarab Beetle will increase in health and number as a result of Lands End plant community restoration. San Franciscans have championed in the study and preservation of wildlife since the 19th century, as demonstrated by well-known activists such as John Muir and his San Francisco-based Sierra Club.
