## FORT BAKER 300-YARD RIFLE RANGE RESTORATION ADVISORY BOARD (RAB)

Fort Baker is located in the Golden Gate Recreation Area National Park in Marin County, California. The US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) is investigating the Fort Baker 300-Yard Rifle Range under the Defense Environmental Restoration Program for Formerly Used Defense Sites (DERP-FUDS).

The Department of Defense (DOD) encourages community involvement in the environmental restoration process. A Restoration Advisory Board (RAB) is one of many methods the USACE may use to facilitate public participation at a FUDS. RABs provide a collaborative forum for the community, government agencies, tribes and installation decision makers to discuss and identify the most efficient and productive means to restore the environment. RAB members are asked to meet regularly to review and comment on technical documents and plans relating to the ongoing environmental studies and restoration activities at the site. Members will be expected to serve as liaisons with the community and be available to meet with community members and groups. RAB members serve as volunteers and provide individual advice to decision makers on environmental restoration plans for the Fort Baker 300-Yard Rifle Range.
