Pacific Conservation Area

Pacifica Conservation Area: South of Mussel Rock to McNee Ranch State Park

San Mateo County

The Pacifica Conservation Area consists of coastal lands south of the City of Daly City's Mussel Rock Park to McNee Ranch State Park. The area has patches of critical habitat for numerous species and several cultural resources, including sites of Native American establishments, of the 1769 exploratory expedition of Gaspar de Portola, early farming and ranching, and associated with the early development of Pacifica and the Nike Missile defense system. The steep coastal bluffs, rugged landscape, sheer cliffs, and crashing surf are a visual icon of the San Mateo County Coast. Outdoor recreation and tourism play a major role in attracting visitors to the region and contributing significantly to the local economy. Conservation efforts could provide valuable trail linkages to the Coastal Trail and the Bay Area Ridge Trail. Land conservation in this area would also protect undeveloped coastal lands, provide a connection between Milagra Ridge and Sweeney Ridge, and complete an open space corridor between Pedro Point and Devil's Slide. It would further contribute to the preservation of critical resources along the San Mateo County coast and would enhance the mosaic of protected lands that could provide connections to public lands and provide access to a wealth of recreational, natural, cultural, and scenic resources of the San Francisco Bay Area.

San Mateo County

The Gateway to the San Mateo County Coast is an area of unprotected open space and agricultural lands located along State Highway 92 as it travels west over the crest of the San Francisco peninsula and drops dramatically into the Pilarcitos Creek watershed on its way to the San Mateo County coast. The upper reaches of this watershed are largely undeveloped and are characterized by sweeping views of the San Mateo Coast, deep canyons, and a series of ridges covered with dense coastal scrub. A number of endangered and special status species depend on these coastal creeks, including the federally listed summer steelhead trout. Further down the watershed, the canyons open to fertile valleys supporting a variety of agricultural uses. Many local farmers depend on these lands and have formed the backbone of the community here for multiple generations. The Gateway to the San Mateo County Coast area lies at the fringe of urban expansion, with Highway 92 serving as the most heavily traveled transportation corridor straddling the mid-peninsula region from the urbanized communities along San Francisco Bay to the coastal communities in and around the City of Half Moon Bay. Land conservation in this area can help protect the agricultural uses, watershed functions, and land connectivity needed to ensure the health of and access to this open space network.

Montara Mountain Complex

San Mateo County

Located just seven miles south of San Francisco in San Mateo County, the Montara Mountain complex has many regionally significant conservation values. The complex supports distinctive coastal scrub and coastal chaparral communities with numerous threatened, rare, and endangered plant and animal species. These species include the endemic Montara Manzanita, the federally endangered Hinkman's cinquefoil, the federally endangered San Bruno Elfin Butterfly, and the federally threatened California Red-Legged Frog. The area is home to the headwaters of five watersheds that flow to the coast, including Denniston Creek, San Vicente Creek, and Martini Creek. Key trail connections run through this area to existing public lands, and an opportunity exists to add a key link to the California Coastal Trail. The area is also highly scenic and visible for a significant stretch of Highway 1, which runs through the area. Over 200 acres of land are in agricultural production in this area, including Denniston Valley on Rancho Corral de Tierra, which is considered some of the most productive agricultural land in California. The protection of this area complements the surrounding protected lands and will create a regionally important protected open space complex.
