I apologize in advance for this lengthy dissertation regarding a walk I take frequently. I began taking walks up Tennessee Valley Road (TVR) to the Rhubarb and down TVR to the Oakwood Valley Trail about a month ago. There is dog feces, and bags of it all over the road edge and trails. I've seen a dead snake with it's head crushed, evidence of dogs in the Oakwood Valley Creek, barking at the bridge and Banana Slugs smashed on the trails. I frequently hear people shouting for their dogs, several dogs barking as they meet on the trail and see pets off trail into the habitat. I see more of the same on a daily basis. I've continued on my walks in spite of the obstacles because it is a grand privilege to have this fragile environment so close with the ability to walk through it. I've sent this information to the TCSD General Manager Mr. Jon Elam as well.

I am troubled by the lack of concern by pet owners, and the apparent inability of NPS to enforce current rules or inform the Public of trail access for dogs at the trail heads and/or on the web. The person I talked with at the non-emergency NPS number informed me I cannot tell people on trails what the rules are because they do that with signage and maps they give out. Doesn't sound like the web or the information from Ms. Smith in the email below is accurate, but at this point I am so confused. Although enforcement seems to be hit or miss, clear signage is a must to at least officially inform pet owners of their responsibilities while using the trails. However, the trails are not clearly posted and I believe most pet owners assume they can let dogs loose to roam at will in the Recreation area. Regardless, I will comply with the instruction given by NPS personnel and just take photos going forward for submission to NPS, you Mr. Dean and to Ms. Shirwin Smith per Ranger Airey.

I was on the Rhubarb this morning and encountered a woman with 2 dogs. One was on lease and the other was off lease. I stopped off the trail, as I typically do to let her pass. I asked if she knew the trail is off limits to dogs (email from NPS below) and offered printouts from the GGNRA web page and or the email from NPS (Ms. Smith), but she angrily retorted (b) (6) (TCSD GM) told her dogs are allowed on the Rhubarb and proceeded down the trail. She yelled back at me from down the path why wasn't I "going after" bike riders on the Rhubarb. I might ask her the same, but didn't. I was there to walk not talk. Regardless, she called me "a crotchety old" man and continued down the path. Not sure why she engaged in name calling because I tried to be polite by saying "mam did you know..." and by offering the email and web page printout.

I went on to the Oakwood Valley Trail (OWVT) and encountered a gentleman standing roughly 60 feet up the trail away from his dog down at the being of the trail. As I approached I said, "Sir did you know this is a leash only trail." and offered him the same information I tried to impart to the first dog owner. He initially accused me of being one of those dog owners not picking up after their animal, leaving feces filled bags on the trail. I don't have a dog and didn't have one with me. Regardless, he didn't want my information either and did not lease his animal. He stared back down toward TVR to collect his dog yelling over his shoulder about my being the pooper enforcer etc. We had a brief verbal confrontation at that time because he was calling me names and started back toward me up the trail. I wasn't sure of his intent, but was tired of being called names. As we got closer to each other, I sternly told him to stop calling me names. He accused me of getting too close to him so I turned and said I was calling the NPS # phone provided below. I am a bit old (70), but didn't want to get into a physical confrontation over dog feces/control. He called me a few more names and headed up the Oakwood Valley Trail toward Oakwood Fire Road with his dog following him from behind. I called the non-emergency NPS number to report the encounter and asked for assistance. At first they were reluctant to send anyone, and I attempted to explain that I was not comfortable about the apparent hostility displayed by dog owners so far. This ended with a ranger to contact me today.

When I got back to TVR on the Fire Road, I went back to the OWVT to retrieve a glove I lost. As I approached the trail from the road, I saw a lady with a dog off lease headed up the Rhubarb. I called after her (mam) and informed her about the trail being off limits to dogs. She asked if I were a Ranger and got very angry when said no, but I had the information if she wanted to see it. She put her dog on lease and crossed the foot bridge with


her dog barking and snarling at me on her way to OWVT. I thanked her for leaving her animal on lease as she headed off to the OWVT. She was yelling back at me while I walked back home on TVR as she was yelling a lot of stuff I really did not hear clearly, heard something about dog owners and their rights. She was still yelling at me when the fellow I encountered earlier on the OWVT met her. They both started yelling at me and calling me names from across the road. The gentlemen even stopped his car in the middle of the road while I was trying to get my phone out to call NPS back again. He took my picture on his cell phone and accused me of bullying him, and even worse women.

When I talked with the person at the NPS non-emergency number, he told me I should not be advising people of the dog trail rules because that is distributed at Park locations or by the Rangers. He seemed to say that the web page and the map given out are not the same. When I spoke to the Ranger Airey at the OWVT, he said he thought the Rhubarb was the State's responsibility. He restated what I was told on the phone. I showed him the email from Ms. Shirwin Smith (NPS) stating it's off limits to dogs. Ranger Airey took my report and suggested I forward my photos/comments to the NPS District Office.

I understand that it's tough to enforce rules due to limited resources and the apparent confusion regarding voice and lease control, and who is ultimately responsible for the Recreation Area. This confusion and clear disregard for the environment is of great concern to me, and should be for all those who like to enjoy this fragile habitat unmolested by obnoxious and rude pet owners who want use The Recreation Area as their personal doggie litter box. I include bike riders who abuse trails (Rhubarb/Oakwood Valley) as obnoxious and rude. The debris dumped in Nyhan Creek adds insult to injury because whoever is dumping junk in the creek appears to be of the same mindset of those leaving dog feces in bags or simply letting their animal(s) defecate on trails leaving for the next passerby.

Thank you and again I apologize for this long message but feel strongly about the peaceful enjoyment of the Recreation Area in Tam Valley.

I submit a small sample of trail conditions. Some photos taken today (5/17/2013) and some on previous days. I usually walk from 7am to about 9am. I include photos of debris in Nyhan Creek taken that was reported to TCSD. Isn't dumping and littering on Federal land a crime?

The National Park Service (NPS) Pacific West Regional Office has forwarded your letter of November 19, 2008, regarding off-leash dogs in the Plover Protection Area at Ocean Beach, to us for response. Thank you for taking the time to let the NPS know your concerns. We also very much appreciate your participation in docent programs at Ocean Beach, which do help the park communicate the importance of protecting the Western Snowy Plover.

With your experience in the park, you are probably aware that the current dog walking status in Golden Gate National Recreation Area (GGNRA) is the result of a federal court decision in 2005, which essentially re-established the off-leash (or "voice control") areas of the 1979 GGNRA Advisory Commission Pet Policy until the NPS goes through a rulemaking process to establish a new dog walking rule for GGNRA. A new rule would include the Ocean Beach Plover Protection Area. Additional information about the current dog walking status is on our website at <http://www.nps.gov/goga/planyourvisit/pets.htm>

As part of the rulemaking process, the NPS is developing a draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) which we anticipate will go out for public comment in the Spring of 2010. A final EIS and dog walking rule should be completed in 2011. With your concerns regarding dogs in the Plover Protection Area, we hope you will submit comments on the DEIS. To add your name to the mailing address for notification of the availability of the DEIS for public review and comment, please call our project information line at 415-561-4728.

We do agree that the enforcement of the seasonal leash restriction at Ocean Beach is important for the survival of the Western Snowy Plover, and our Law Enforcement staff is aware of the need for enforcement and does patrol the area. However, our staffing is not sufficient to maintain a regular presence at any one GGNRA site.

While you are visiting Ocean Beach, or any other GGNRA site, please do call our park dispatch center (415-561-5656 for emergencies, or 415-561-5505 for non emergencies) if you need assistance or to report a wildlife disturbance incident.

Your letter of May 3, 2010, regarding the increase in unleashed dogs on Ocean Beach was forwarded to me by the Superintendent's office here at Golden Gate National Recreation Area (GGNRA), as I am involved in the dog management planning process here. Thank you for taking the time to describe your concerns; I apologize for my delay in responding to you.

The current dog walking management situation at Ocean Beach is the result of a federal court ruling in 2004, which followed a move by GGNRA in 2002 change from allowing some areas of voice control, to instituting the National Park Service (NPS) regulation requiring dogs to be on leash anywhere they are allowed in a national park. The court ruling directed the NPS to go through a rulemaking process before any change in management of dog walking could occur at GGNRA. That ruling resulted in the park having to return to a previous, long-standing policy and practice, the 1979 Citizen's Advisory Commission Pet Policy, which set up some specific areas of voice-control in GGNRA; Ocean Beach was one of those areas.

In 2004, the park had already initiated a rulemaking process for dog management, which will culminate this fall with the release of a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) for public comment. However, because that DEIS would take time to develop, and in order to provide protection for the federally-threatened western snowy plover that over-winters at Crissy Field and Ocean Beach, in 2008 the NPS completed an interim rulemaking requiring that pets be leashed all year except May 15 to July 1 in the Ocean Beach Plover Protection Area between Sloat Boulevard and Stairwell 21, and in the Crissy Field Wildlife Protection Area. That special regulation, combined with the 1979 Pet Policy which allows voice control dog-walking all year on the rest of Ocean Beach, is what has resulted in mix of allowed dog walking uses currently in place on Ocean Beach.

We do try to maintain the signs at all the entry points to the Ocean Beach Plover Protection Area, although they are regularly vandalized, and signs are also in place on the beach at the north and south boundary of the Protection Area. However, on Ocean Beach as well as in the Wildlife Protection Area at Crissy Field, it is not uncommon to find dog walkers who do not read, or disregard, the signs. Both NPS Park Rangers and U.S. Park Police patrol the Plover Protection

area, but given the overall size of the area they are responsible for, they may not be able to patrol any one area as often as would be optimal.

Given your concerns and interest in better management of dog walking at Ocean Beach, I very much hope that you will review and comment on the DEIS for dog management when it comes out later this year. The preferred alternative in that DEIS will propose the elements of a new dog walking regulation for GGNRA. We received your letter of June 22, 2009, describing your experiences while visiting Fort Funston, one of the sites within Golden Gate National Recreation Area (GGNRA). Thank you for taking the time to let us know your concerns regarding the prevalence of dog walkers, and the degree to which they impacted your visit.

The current status of dog walking in GGNRA, resulting from a federal court decision in 2005, does allow dogs to be walked either on leash or under voice control in a number of areas; Fort Funston is one of those areas. Although GGNRA would not designate any of the areas where voice control is currently allowed as a “dog park”, that characterization is often applied to Fort Funston by dog walking advocates. In response, we are developing a guide to be distributed broadly that clearly defines where and how dog owners can walk their pets in GGNRA. The guide will emphasize the requirement to control pets when visiting GGNRA areas so that neither visitors nor resources are harmed. That information is also available on the park's website (www.nps.gov/goga/planyourvisit/pets.htm).

Finally, you may be interested to know that the park is working to address dog management issues, including that of commercial dog walkers, through a negotiated rulemaking process and a parallel environmental analysis that will, potentially, develop a new regulation for dog walking in GGNRA. We are currently developing the draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) which will present a range of options for dog management at this park; that draft is expected to be out for public comment in early fall of next year. If you would like to be notified when the DEIS is available for public comment, or if you have any questions regarding the park's dog management process, please contact Shirwin Smith at (415) 561-4947 or Shirwin_Smith@nps.gov.

We very much regret that your visit was less than ideal, and appreciate receiving detailed feedback such as yours as we work towards a solution to dog management at GGNRA.

Thank you for your letter regarding off leash dogs in Golden Gate National Recreation Area. Although there is a federal regulation which requires that dogs be on a leash no longer than 6 feet wherever they are allowed in National Park Service (NPS) areas, at present we must also comply with a recent court ruling which limits our authority to enforce that regulation throughout GGNRA. Although this has constrained our ability to limit off leash dogwalking in some areas, we remain concerned for the safety of our visitors and for the protection of park resources. If you ever need to report an incident and one of our law enforcement staff are not in the area, do call our communications center directly; the numbers are 415-561-5510 (for non-emergency), or 415-561-5656 (emergencies only).

With your concerns, you may know that we are hoping to find an appropriate solution for dog management here at GGNRA through a negotiated rulemaking process. The goal of a negotiated rulemaking committee would be to “determine..whether there are circumstances under which off-leash dogwalking could be consistent with (NPS) mandates and with significant interests of the public”. If you would like to learn more about negotiated rulemaking, please go to our web site: www.nps.gov/goga/pets/regneg/

The status of this process is that the notice required to establish the Negotiated Rulemaking Committee is currently in Washington for final approval; we hope to begin committee meetings in early 2006. There will be many opportunities for public participation, both by attending those meetings and by participating in the public comment and scoping meetings of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process which will run concurrently with the negotiated rulemaking. The schedule for meetings will be available on our website and will be sent to those on our mailing list.

Dear (b) (6) :

Thank you for your letter to Superintendent O'Neill letting us know about your experience with off leash dogs in the Fort Mason area. Although the park does have signs and brochures (<http://www.nps.gov/goga/pets/pdf/pets.pdf>) explaining the federal regulation, which requires that dogs be on a leash no longer than 6 feet wherever they are allowed in National Park Service (NPS) areas there is certainly not always voluntary compliance by park visitors. Please do call our communications center directly if you need to report an incident and one of our law enforcement staff are not in the area; the numbers are 415-561-5510 (for non-emergency), or 415-561-5656 (emergencies only).

With your concerns, you may be interested to know that we have an opportunity to move forward to find an appropriate solution for dog management here at GGNRA. The park was given approval by the NPS to begin a negotiated rulemaking process that may result in a regulation change. If you would like to learn more about negotiated rulemaking (reg-neg), here is our web site which gives the current status of the reg-neg, and all the steps that led up to the NPS decision to proceed with rulemaking: <http://www.nps.gov/goga/pets/regneg> However, unless and until the existing regulation is changed, it will continue to be the regulation in effect here at the park.

The status of the reg-neg process is that we're working with a team of neutral facilitators which is managing the first phase of the process, an assessment which will determine if such a process has a reasonable chance of success. The assessment phase began in June with confidential interviews conducted by the neutral team with a broad range of stakeholder representatives to gain a better understanding of stakeholders' perspectives on dog management issues and how they would like to see their interests represented in a reg-neg process. The interviews were completed by August; the team then prepared a Situation Assessment Report summarizing their findings. You'll find the Assessment Report at: http://www.nps.gov/goga/pets/regneg/pdf/final_ggnra_assessment_report.pdf

Based on the results of the interviews, the report recommends to the NPS that the agency proceed with establishment of a reg-neg committee, and proposes names for committee membership that would create a balanced representation of interests. The goal of the committee

would be to “determine..whether there are circumstances under which off-leash dogwalking could be consistent with (NPS) mandates and with significant interests of the public”. If a committee is formed, there will be many opportunities for public participation, both by attending reg-neg committee meetings and participating in the public comment and scoping meetings of the NEPA (National Environmental Policy Act) process which will run concurrently with the rulemaking.

As to categories to chart, the list looks good, but do check that anything with "pet", "leash" or "dog" is classed as a "Dog" incident. Those may be the second or third descriptor in the case incident categorization. Vandalism is definitely a good category to use.

As to those omitted from analysis:

Everyone,

Based input from the group, and a longer conversation with Mia about the specifics regarding the Warner Canyon owlet, I think we have arrived at how to proceed:

1. We would like to preserve the owlet as a taxidermic mount for educational purposes. Mia indicated that Muir Woods has a permit to salvage endangered species including SPOW's and to use collected specimens for educational purposes. Mia also thought she had funding to cover the costs of the taxidermic work.
2. We would extract necessary feathers for submission to San Jose State researchers for their genetic work prior to taxidermic preparation.
3. We would conduct spotted owl outreach in Mill Valley/Warner Canyon area, including information about how the use of poisons (rodenticides) can harm non-target wildlife such as SPOW's, and why it is important to preserve open lands for wildlife/owls. This would probably entail developing and distributing a flyer or brochure.

We felt that based on inspection of the owlet while it was still alive, and after it was collected, there were not outward signs of poisoning or external bleeding (including possible injury from the dog) that might have warranted a need for necropsy--we felt that the necropsy was likely to come back inconclusive or that the owlet died of natural causes and would involve the destruction of the specimen. We arrived at the conclusion that the educational benefit of the owlet was greater than what we were likely to learn from a necropsy. We also will be proceeding with some community outreach, which is probably the approach we would have ended up taking even if we determined the owlet was poisoned.

We've received your letter of January 7, 2008, sent to General Superintendent Brian O'Neill regarding the unfortunate incidents you've experienced while visiting Crissy Field's East Beach in Golden Gate National Recreation Area. Thank you for taking the time to explain in detail what happened, and for your suggestions as to how uses might be separated in that area.

Given your experience, and your understandable safety concerns for yourself and other visitors to Crissy Field, you may be interested to know that the park is engaged in a project to find an appropriate solution for dog management here at GGNRA through a negotiated rulemaking process and an accompanying National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process. Together these processes will result in a parkwide dog management plan and, potentially, a special regulation for dog management in GGNRA. You can find more information about both the negotiated rulemaking and NEPA processes at the park's web site: www.nps.gov/goga/planyourvisit/pets.htm

The Negotiated Rulemaking Committee, appointed by the Secretary of the Interior and representing the diverse interests likely to be affected by a dog management plan held meetings from early 2006 through October 2007. Although consensus was not reached on all points of discussion, there was much information brought out by the various stakeholders and members of the public regarding the best way to balance user group interests with visitor safety and resource protection needs. Suggestions such as yours were made during the discussions and that input, as well as the information you have provided, is helping the National Park Service develop a dog management plan and prepare the Draft Environmental Impact Statement required for this project.

I hope that your recovery is going smoothly and that you will soon return to the waterfront you so clearly enjoy. Thank you again for your detailed input; information such as yours is so very necessary in the development of a workable dog management plan for GGNRA.

I asked (b) (6), (b) (7) if they had come out the trail from the parking lot, and if he saw any signs on the gate. He replied, "Yeah, the sign says leash pets." The entrance to Tennessee Valley is clearly signed, "No Pets." The sign is twelve inches high by fourteen inches wide. I then asked him if he was contacted by a park volunteer about the dogs (b) (6), (b) (7) replied, "Yes, the lady told us we could not have a dog. We were right over there." (b) (6), (b) (7) pointed over towards the end of the Tennessee Valley fire road.

(b) (6), (b) (7) stated, "Look, all we were doing was trying to take our dogs for a walk, can we leave now." I told him that he could not leave. I then requested (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) to give me a driver's license. He stated, "I don't have mine with me it is at home." I then asked for both of their names and date of birth. Neither of them wanted to give me any information. I told both of them that they were in violation of park rules having a pet in an area closed to pets. I told them that I had to file a report and that they could not leave until I identified them (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) stated, "I don't feel comfortable with giving you that information. We are going to leave now." Both (b) (6), (b) (7) and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) disobeyed my lawful order and left the beach.

I tried to get out on my portable radio to request a second unit to head my way, but I could not get through on the beach. I decided to let them head out on the trail. I told them that they had to leave the area with their dogs, and that I would follow them out. I walked back to my vehicle to use my mobile radio. At 1730 hrs., I was able to request another unit to respond to my location. Park dispatch requested over the radio for any unit to respond to Tennessee Valley. There was no one in the area, and then they requested 551 Ranger LEONE to respond. Ranger LEONE was at Bldg. 1056 but her radio could not receive the transmission. 531 ranger Phillips called ranger LEONE on her cell phone and informed her of the request for a second unit at Tennessee Valley. She answered up on the radio and responded.

At approximately 1750 hrs., I met ranger LEONE on the Tennessee Valley trail and we re-contacted (b) (6), (b) (7) and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). I asked again for their identification (b) (6), (b) (7) produced a USA Passport. He pulled it out of his back pant pocket. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) gave me his California driver's license. He pulled it out of his wallet which was in his back pant pocket. Ranger LEONE conducted a Terry Search for weapons on both subjects. She did not find any weapons. I performed a computer check on (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) name and date of birth, and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) returned with no wants or warrants. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) returned with a \$2,000.00 misdemeanor bench warrant out of San Francisco County for 2000 VC 12500a. Ranger LEONE and I followed (b) (6), (b) (7) and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) to the entrance gate at the Tennessee Valley parking lot. This was the preferred location where we wanted to place (b) (6), (b) (7) under arrest. Both (b) (6), (b) (7) and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) lied to me about not having any identification, and that they had walked to the beach from (b) (6), (b) (7) residence at Tam Valley. (b) (6), (b) (7) and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) drove to Tennessee Valley in a (b) (6), (b) (7) truck. (b) (6), (b) (7) had an address out of (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). Both disobeyed my lawful orders. I told them to stay and they left the area. Both of them were very nervous and wanted to immediately leave the area when they saw me approaching.

At 1834 hrs., I confirmed the warrant and placed (b) (6), (b) (7) under arrest. He was placed in hand cuffs, checked for tightness, and then double locked. At the entrance gate I issued (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) two citations: MVN K109502 for 36 CFR 2.15(a)(2) for pet in a closed area, and MVN K109503 for 36 CFR 2.32(a)(1) Interfering with agency function. I made both of them mandatory appearance. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) was very upset at receiving the citations. He yelled, "Under what authority do you have to issue me a citation. You guys are not even cops, you are park rangers!" I informed him that he was in a national park on federal land, and that I was a federal officer. I was in uniform and driving a clearly marked patrol vehicle. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) took both dogs with him and left the parking lot in his (b) (6), (b) (7) truck CA TAG (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). During the entire contact (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) was nervous, agitated, and angry. He was non compliant.

At 1840 hrs. (b) (6), (b) (7) was transported to Marin County Jail. We arrived at Marin County at approximately 1900 hrs. At the jail I issued (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) two MVN'S: K109504 for 36 CFR 2.15(a)(2) for pet in closed area, and K109505 for 36 CFR 2.32(a)(1) for interfering with agency function. (b) (6), (b) (7) refused to give me a physical address for the citations. I asked him for a parents address or a friends house where he could pick up the mail. He still refused to give a physical address. I requested park dispatch to look for an address in his criminal history paper work. I used (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) was not pleased when I used that address. He stated that it was his parent's house. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) was booked and all units cleared at 1942 hrs.

Howard, Shirwin, Marybeth, and Connie:

At yesterday's meeting one of our employees stated that he has been issued "pepper spray" by the Trust as a means to deal with aggressive dogs. That statement requires some clarification and context.

As a result of dogs menacing our employees in the field for some period of time and following an incident where an employee was actually bitten, our safety manager, Howard Rudolf, contacted the US Postal Service to find out how they deal with aggressive dogs. Howard was told that they provide their employees with an animal repellent sold under the trade name of "HALT!" (One of HALT's ads says the USPS has been using it since 1966.) While HALT is a form of pepper spray in that the active ingredient is capsaicin, I understand it is less potent than the type of pepper spray that would be typically carried by law enforcement officers. HALT was also recommended by SF Animal Care and Control and the Berkeley Humane Society.

Howard then arranged for the Behavior and Training Manager of the Berkeley Humane Society to train our employees on the best ways to deal with aggressive dogs, the proper use of HALT, what not to do, how to fend the animals off, etc. Only those employees who went through the training were issued HALT!. Our understanding is that while HALT effectively deters canine attacks by temporarily blinding the dogs, it does not seriously injure them.

I hope this message effectively corrects any misimpressions that may have been created by our employee's statement yesterday. Please let me know if there are any questions. Thanks very much.

LAW ENFORCEMENT

Incident: Assault and Battery at Sloat Parking
Ranger: Knowles

- On Sunday, September 15th, Rangers and USPP Officer Smith were dispatched to the Sloat parking lot reference an assault and battery. Upon arrival, the reporting party stated that a surfer (*who has been staying in the area*) was battered by five Hispanic males. The victim was contacted and refused to provide a statement or file a complaint. The suspects had been reported to have returned to the area later that morning, but law enforcement staff was unable to locate the suspects. The investigation is ongoing.

Operation: “Cup Courtesy II”
Ranger: Brown

- On Wednesday, September 11th, 12th, & 14th, Rangers conducted Operation Cup Courtesy aboard “Ranger-1” in the San Francisco Bay. Ranger-1 personnel enforced the closure of the Alcatraz buffer zone due to high vessel traffic from America's Cup. Most bay area boaters were in compliance, with the Americas Cup support vessels being the biggest violators of the Alcatraz closures. Several contacts were made to enforce closures.

Event: Larceny from Auto
Ranger: Airey

- On Thursday, September 12th, Rangers responded to a larceny from auto at the McCullough roundabout. The front driver's side window of the vehicle was broken and a gray cotton backpack was taken from the front passenger seat containing personnel property worth \$300.00. No possible suspects were observed.

Event: Dog Rescue at Fort Funston
Ranger: Warmerdam

- On Thursday, September 12th, Rangers responded to a report from Park Communications regarding a dog trapped on the cliff just south of Battery Davis at Fort Funston. Rangers and San Francisco Fire Department personnel deployed a technical rope rescue system to retrieve the pet which was approximately 100 feet below the cliff edge. Investigation revealed that the dog was the responsibility of a professional dog walker who allowed the dog to run off leash and chase other dogs near the cliff edge. The park has several signs warning the public to stay back from the cliffs and advise that people and pets have fallen. Because the dog was not under control and needed to be rescued by emergency personnel the professional dog walker was issued a citation for creating a hazardous condition.

Operation: “It's Our Business”
Rangers: Kanuch

- On Friday, September 13th Rangers conducted operation “It's Our Business” with the GGNRA Business Office. Ranger-1 personnel worked directly with Maria Banuelos from the park service concessionaire's management which includes Alcatraz Cruises to insure that visitors receive the highest quality experience as they are transported to and from Alcatraz Island. Additionally the operation will provide the business office with a true view of what occurs out at sea.

Event: Larceny from Auto

- On Friday, September 13th, Rangers responded to a larceny from auto that occurred in the vicinity of Battery Spencer. A purse was stolen from the vehicle containing \$500 in cash, a Canadian passport, and other personal effects. No possible suspects were observed.

Rangers observed a PG&E contractor truck and chipper parked at the west end of Fairway Drive with cut willow tree branches in the roadway. Lifeguard: Ocean Beach

- On Sunday, September 15th, Ocean Beach Lifeguards responded to a report of an unconscious male in the surf zone near stairwell 7. Lifeguards entered the water and rescued the subject. The investigation revealed that he was surfing and struck his head in the shallow waters. He was placed on a backboard, with C-spine precautions and transported to the San Francisco Fire Department. The patient was alert and oriented prior to leaving the beach.

Event: Bike Accident

- On Friday, September 13th, Rangers responded to a bike accident on Conzelman just above the Dillingham entrance. The victim suffered a broken wrist and was subsequently transported by Southern Marin Fire to SF General.

RECLAMATION

Operation: “Jubata Jumpers”
Ranger: Kanuch

- On Wednesday, September 11th, Rangers and Stinson Lifeguards provided support services to GGNRA Resource Management to assist in the eradication of invasive Jubata Grass throughout the Marin Headlands coastal areas. Utilizing “Ranger 1” as a mobile staging area the Resource Management & contractors were then transferred to the smaller Zodiac to access the shallow areas along the Headlands water ways and spray the invasive grass with pesticide. The operation was another collaborative success with law enforcement, resource management, lifeguards, and contractors.

Operation: "For the Birds"
Lifeguard: Burns

- On Thursday, September 12th, Stinson Beach Lifeguards provided support services to Point Reyes NS Resource Management Ben Becker Ph.D. with bird research on the offshore rock known as Stormy Stack. The operation required a strong background in local oceanography and technical skill operating an Inflatable Rescue Boat at a remote and potentially hazardous area. The operation was a continuation of similar research a few weeks earlier at Bird Rock. Both were a step towards better research and will become part of an annual collaboration between GOGA & PORE.

Event: Animals and Wildlife
Lifeguard: Dierks

- On Saturday, September 14th, Ocean Beach lifeguards responded to a call from Marine Mammal Center (MMC) for a porpoise body recovery. The location was below Ft. Funston glider port, on the beach. Access to this area is limited by tidal conditions so lifeguards had to wait until a low enough tide to execute the recovery. Lifeguards picked up two MMC volunteers in the Beach Patrol vehicles and transported them to the porpoise which required four personnel to load into the bed of the truck due to its large size and weight. This is only the most recent incident involving porpoises washing up on Ocean Beach. Over the past two months there have been at least 10 recoveries made by Ocean Beach Patrol. Some weeks there are two or more incidents and beach patrol staff is working with MMC personnel to understand why this is occurring.

TRAINING
