Narrative:

On 04/23/2013, at approximately 1319 hours, I responded to Crissy Field, in the area of 937 Mason Street, following a report of a dog bite victim at that location.

Upon arrival I met with SFFD medics who were treating the victim. I saw that the victim, identified as [REDACTED] had at multiple lacerations and puncture wounds to the left side of her face. At my request an SFFD medic used my force issued camera to photograph [REDACTED] injuries.

SFFD Medic 55 transported [REDACTED] to UC Hospital for additional treatment.

I spoke with witness [REDACTED] who told me she saw a dog bite [REDACTED] in the face while she was on the beach with her son.

I met with the dog's owner, identified as [REDACTED], stated that she was sitting on the beach with her pitbull terrier "Stitch," and her friend, identified as witness [REDACTED], when [REDACTED] approached and asked if she could pet the dog.

[REDACTED] said that she did not believe her dog was dangerous and she told [REDACTED] that it was okay to pet Stitch. [REDACTED] told me that [REDACTED] bent over and began to pat Stitch on his back end when he suddenly turned around and bit [REDACTED] once in the face.

[REDACTED] and witnesses said that the dog was leashed at the time of the incident.

Witness [REDACTED] said that she had owned Stitch previously but had given him to [REDACTED] because she no longer had the time to properly care for him. [REDACTED] said that the dog has never been aggressive while she owned him.

Stitch is a pitbull terrier, gray and white in color, weighs approximately sixty pounds, and is four years old. Stitch was leashed, muzzled, unaggressive, and under [REDACTED] control during my interview with her.

[REDACTED] told me that Stitch had recently been spayed and had his shots. [REDACTED] said the dog was licensed in San Francisco.

A CLETS check of [REDACTED] through USPP communications personnel returned with [REDACTED] warrant out of the San Mateo County Sheriffs' Office for a [REDACTED]

I requested assistance and Sgt. Williams and ID Tech Whalen arrived on scene.

I placed [REDACTED] under arrest for the confirmed warrant and transported her to San Francisco County Jail 1 for processing.

Sgt. Williams contacted the San Francisco ACC unit and they responded to the scene and took custody of the dog (ACC case no. 864-2866).

I faxed a copy of this report to SFPD Ofc. Denny along with an ACC Animal Bite Report.

I made a CD containing three pictures of victim [REDACTED] injuries and entered the CD into the property box at 1217 as evidence.
