

Campground Regulations

Campsites

Up to two vehicles, three tents, and eight people are permitted per campsite. Keep campsites clean. Store food in a hard-sided container at all times, preferably in your vehicle, and place trash in dumpsters. Do not ditch or level ground.

Fires are permitted only in established metal fire rings. Do not leave unattended. Only dead and down wood may be collected. Do not cut down limbs or standing trees. Use of chainsaws is not permitted. Fireworks are prohibited.

Natural and Cultural Resources

Flowers, trees, rocks, antlers, bones, petroglyphs, pictographs, and any other natural or cultural features may not be damaged, defaced or removed from the park. Collection of bristlecone pine wood is strictly prohibited. Feeding, touching or disturbing wildlife in any way is not permitted.

Fishing is allowed with a Nevada state fishing license, which can be purchased in the town of Baker (five miles east of the park). Use of live bait is prohibited. Fish entrails should be buried. Do not move fish!

Pets are allowed on a leash (6 feet or shorter) in developed areas. Pets may not be left unattended while tied up (to a tree, picnic table, etc.) but may be left in vehicles, in the shade with a window cracked.

Quiet Hours are from 10 pm to 6 am. Generators may be used from 8 am to 6 pm daily. Please respect your fellow campers.

Weapons

The use of any weapon is strictly prohibited in Great Basin National Park. This includes firearms and any other implement designed to discharge projectiles. Speak with a ranger at either visitor center for clarification.

Orient Yourself

Visitor Center Hours

Great Basin National Park has two visitor centers (all hours are in Pacific Time):

- The **Great Basin Visitor Center** is located in the town of Baker, NV, approximately 5 miles to the east of the park entrance. It is open seasonally, so please check the bulletin boards for current hours. During the busy season, from Memorial Day to Labor Day, it is typically open from 8 am-5:30 pm.
- The **Lehman Caves Visitor Center** is open year-round. Winter hours are from 8 am-4:30 pm. Busy season hours are usually from 8 am-5 pm. Please check the bulletin boards outside of the visitor centers for the most up-to-date information.

Interpretive Programs

Tours of Lehman Caves are given year-round, at least four times daily, with additional trips into the cave available in the spring, summer and fall. Throughout the busy season, there may also be a wealth of other interpretive programs to attend, such as evening campfire programs, guided hikes and children's programs. Please check the bulletin boards in any of the campgrounds or ask a ranger at either of the visitor centers for the most up-to-date information.

Recreational Activities

Recreational activities abound in Great Basin National Park! You will find detailed information about hikes and other area information in the free park map and newspaper, both of which are available at the campgrounds and the visitor centers.

Potable Water is available at spigots in the campgrounds and dump station during the summer or year-round at the Lehman Caves Visitor Center. Waste water should be dumped down the pit toilets. Do not dump waste water in streams, at campsites, or at water spigots. Bathing and washing dishes, utensils, or clothing at water spigots is prohibited.
