A sample of Grand Canyon National Park's source water, the Roaring Springs Cave, detected fecal indicators (E. coli). On October 28, 2014, we learned that one of our routine samples collected on October 27, 2014 was total coliform positive. On November 1, 2014 a follow up sample and test of the source water at Roaring Spring Cave returned negative for fecal indicators.

We are pleased to announce that the problem has been corrected and that it is no longer necessary to boil water. We apologize for any inconvenience and thank you for your patience.
