From 1785-1828 the Potomac Canal was being built. The five skirting canals were at House Falls, Shenandoah Falls, Seneca Falls, Great Falls, and Little Falls. Great Falls was the largest of these five projects.

Use the space below to draw the shape of a great blue heron's footprints.




The Patowmack Canal

The Patowmack Canal established a very important trade route to the port of Georgetown; it was one of America's first water highways. The map below is a map of the canal at Great Falls. Put an X on the map near the numbers for places you were able to visit while at the park. Use a colored marker or take pictures in these areas and email them along with your completed activities.

Captain George Pointer

George Pointer was a man who worked on the Patowmack Canal for over 43 years. In 1829 he wrote a historic letter to the directors of the newly formed C&O Canal Company. George Pointer would have been present, just a boy then, in 1789 when the survey mark was made at stop 6 on the map below. Later in the early 1800's, as a man, he was appointed superintendent engineer in charge of construction of the wing dam at stop 1.
