## Grand Teton National Park News Release

### Chip Seal Projects Scheduled For Roads in Grand Teton National Park

Chip sealing work is scheduled to be underway, weather depending, on several roads within Grand Teton National Park from August 1 through August 4. Beginning Tuesday, August 1, a chip seal will be applied to the Antelope Flats Road from the junction with Highway 26/89/191 to mailbox corner and continuing south to Gros Ventre Road near the town of Kelly. On Thursday, August 3, and Friday, August 4, chip seal work will take place on Highway 26/89/191 from Cunningham Cabin to Moran Junction, and Highway 26/287 from Moran Junction to the park's east boundary.

Motorists should expect 15 minute delays between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. daily, while these chip seal projects are being done. A pilot car will escort traffic through the work zone. Work will be completed before the weekend.

Stripes will be applied to the new road surfaces during the week of August 7th; however, the striping projects should not cause significant traffic delays.

In addition to the chip seal work described above, on Wednesday, August 2, a chip seal project will be underway on the Moose-Wilson Road from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Vehicles will not be allowed to travel the road while this work is being done, so hikers wishing to access the Death Canyon trailhead should plan accordingly. During the same time, a dust abatement application will be placed on the unpaved segment of the Moose-Wilson Road and a twenty-six hour temporary closure will preclude through traffic from 6 p.m. August 1 through 8 p.m. August 2.
