Grand Teton and Yellowstone National Parks Observe National Public Lands Day

Visitors entering Grand Teton and Yellowstone national parks on Saturday, September 30, 2006 will have their entrance fees waived in recognition of National Public Lands Day. To observe the thirteenth anniversary of National Public Lands Day, all entry fees, including transportation and commercial tour entrance fees, will be waived for the day. Normally, an entry permit for Grand Teton and Yellowstone national parks costs \$25 per private, non-commercial vehicle.

National Public Lands Day was established in 1993 to increase awareness of the value of all public lands, to foster shared stewardship of these national resources, and to encourage people to volunteer their time. Federal land agencies are creating partnerships with private individuals and citizen groups in an effort to improve, restore or enhance public lands and provide additional opportunities for education, outdoor recreation, and enjoyment.

Visitors are encouraged to take advantage of this free entry day in Grand Teton and Yellowstone. The observance of Public Lands Day in September offers visitors an excellent opportunity to find solitude, catch the fall color display, and experience exceptional wildlife viewing.
