



Accessibility

Grand Teton National Park and the John D. Rockefeller, Jr., Memorial Parkway offer a variety of accessible facilities. Much of the park and parkway is managed as wilderness and remains free from development. This handout provides a brief overview. For more information, contact the park.

Access Pass

- Free, lifetime National Park Service pass.
- For U.S. citizens or permanent residents with permanent disabilities. Applicants must provide documentation of qualifications.
- Get a pass in person at a federal recreation site, or mail your application (\$10 processing fee): www.nps.gov/planyourvisit/passes.htm.
- May provide a 50 percent discount on some amenity fees charged for facilities and services such as camping, swimming, boat launching, and specialized interpretive services.
- Generally does NOT cover or reduce special recreation permit fees or fees charged by concessioners.

Service Animals

Service animals are allowed in National Parks. For a definition of a service animal, please visit: www.ada.gov/service_animals_2010.htm. Dogs whose sole function is to provide comfort or emotional support do not qualify as service animals under the ADA. Your service animal may accompany you anywhere, but please note the following:

- **Water:** Potable water is available in all developed areas. Natural water can carry water-borne diseases like giardia.
- **Terrain:** Park trail surfaces vary from compacted soil to uneven, rough surfaces with loose rocks. Slopes are up to 20 percent grade.
- **Waste:** Developed areas have trash cans

to dispose animal waste. Plastic bags are not provided; please bring your own.

- **Wildlife:** Expect wildlife anywhere, at any time. Wolves and bears are of obvious concern, but smaller animals can also cause issues. Animals such as moose can react to your service dog as they would a wolf by charging you and your animal. Be aware that domestic animals may also transmit diseases to wildlife.
- **Backcountry:** The park does not recommend the use of service animals in the backcountry. Having a service animal in the backcountry puts you and the animal at an increased risk for wildlife confrontations.

Concession Facilities

Many services can accommodate people with differing abilities. Some facilities are compliant with the Architectural Barriers Act (ABA). Visitors should call concessioners in advance to discuss their needs and determine what, if any services are available.

- **Jackson Lake Lodge:** 20 accessible guest rooms (four with roll-in showers). Parking, registration, main lobby, decks and restrooms are accessible. A portable strobe and a TDD kit are available. The Mural Room Restaurant and Blue Heron Lounge are accessible. The Pioneer Grill is not, but its menu is available in the Mural Room.
- **Jenny Lake Lodge:** Two accessible guest rooms (no roll-in showers). The lobby, registration area, restaurant and restrooms are accessible.
- **Colter Bay Village:** The Colter Bay Cabins have two fully accessible units. Stores, laundromat, showers, marina, and restaurants are also accessible.

- **Headwaters Lodge at Flagg Ranch:** One fully accessible room with a roll-in shower, and four accessible rooms without roll-in showers.

- **Signal Mountain Lodge**
Two units are fully accessible with roll-in showers. The general store, gift shop, restaurant and registration building are accessible.
- **Leek's Restaurant**
The restaurant and restroom are accessible.

One cabin is fully accessible with a roll-in shower. The main house has a ramp, and an accessible restroom is in a separate building.
