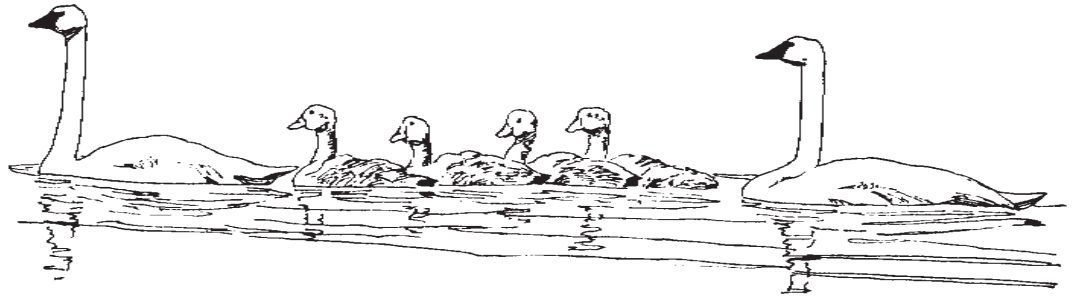




Weddings



The majesty of the Teton Range, the meandering Snake River or the lapping waves of Jenny Lake set a beautiful backdrop for your wedding or reception. The park allows wedding ceremonies at numerous locations, however, entrance and permit fees do apply. Entrance fees are based on your location.

Permits	<p>A permit is required to hold a wedding in the park unless it is at the Chapel of the Transfiguration, the Chapel of the Sacred Heart or a concession facility. Visit the Grand Teton website: www.nps.gov/grte/planyourvisit/weddings.htm</p> <p>Complete the required permit application and send it with the non-refundable \$200.00 application fee to: Visitor Services Office PO Box 170 Moose, WY 83012</p>	<p>Please include credit card information with your permit application. We accept Mastercard, Visa, Discover and American Express. Include the type of card, card number, and expiration date.</p> <p>The permit application must be received in the park no less than two weeks prior to your event. Entrance Fees	<p>All wedding participants and guests that pass through an entrance gate are charged the standard entrance fee. Lump sum or advance payments are not accepted.</p> <p>Guests entering the park to attend a wedding</p>	<p>ceremony at the Chapel of the Transfiguration or the Chapel of the Sacred Heart will not be charged an entrance fee. However, if these same guests will be attending a reception inside the park, they will be charged an entrance fee.</p>
Chapels	<p>The Chapel of the Transfiguration and the Chapel of the Sacred Heart operate within Grand Teton National Park following their own church bylaws. Special Regulations	<p>The following special regulations apply to all weddings and receptions held within the park.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Any event that interferes with the normal activities of visitors, such as the closing of trails, overlooks or public use facilities, will not be allowed.• No disturbance of vegetation or other natural objects is allowed. Park regulations do not permit the throwing or scattering of rice, birdseed, flower petals or any similar material.• In addition, the release of animals including birds, butterflies or other insects is prohibited.• No structures of any kind are allowed, including tents, chairs, tables, bands,	<ul style="list-style-type: none">barbeques, sound systems, props, etc. unless inside a concessions building and within the scope of the concessioner's permit or contract.• Historical buildings or other structures may be used as a backdrop only. Buildings cannot be used for attachments (such as banners or flowers) or be incorporated into the ceremony as a stage.• Permittee will assume all responsibility for cleanup of the site.• All vehicles for the wedding party and guests must be parked in designated parking areas.• Carpooling is recommended; parking may be limited in some areas.
Winter Road Closures	<p>From November 1 to May 1, the Teton Park Road is closed from Taggart Lake Trailhead to Signal Mountain Lodge, and the Moose-Wilson Road is</p>	<p>closed from Death Canyon Road to the Granite Canyon Trailhead. Other roads are also closed. Check with the park for access.</p>
