




Weddings



The majesty of the Teton Range, the meandering Snake River or the lapping waves of Jenny Lake set a beautiful backdrop for your wedding or reception. The park allows wedding ceremonies at numerous locations, however, entrance and permit fees do apply. Fees are based on your chosen location.

Permits	<p>A permit is required to hold a wedding in the park except for the chapels within the park listed below.</p> <p>The wedding permit fee is \$100 nonrefundable. Credit card payment is accepted. Drawer 170 Moose, WY 83012</p> <p>Permits are not required for weddings held in the Chapel of the Transfiguration, the Chapel of the Sacred Heart or at a concession facility.</p>
Entrance Fees	<p>All wedding participants and guests that pass through a park entrance gate are charged the standard entrance fee. Lump sum or advance payments are not accepted.</p> <p>Guests entering the park to attend a wedding ceremony at the Chapel of the Transfiguration will not be charged an entrance fee.</p>	<p>The Chapel of the Transfiguration is on private property within the park, therefore the park cannot charge an entrance fee. However, if these same guests will be attending a reception inside the park, they will be charged an entrance fee.</p>
Chapels	<p>The Chapel of the Transfiguration and the Chapel of the Sacred Heart operate within Grand Teton National Park following their own church bylaws. Special Regulations	<p>The following special regulations apply to all weddings and receptions held within the park.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• No disturbance of vegetation or other natural resources is allowed. Park regulations do not allow the throwing or scattering of rice, birdseed or flower petals.• Bands, barbecues, sound systems, props, etc., are not allowed unless inside a concession's building and within the scope of the concessioner's permit or contract.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Any event that interferes with normal visitors activities such as the closing of trails, overlooks or public use facilities will not be allowed.• Permittee will assume all responsibility for site cleanup.• All vehicles for the wedding party and guests must be parked in designated parking areas. Carpooling is recommended; parking may be limited in some areas.
Winter Road Closures	<p>From November 1 to May 1, the Teton Park Road is closed from Taggart Lake Trailhead to Signal Mountain Lodge, and the Moose-Wilson Road is</p>	<p>closed from Death Canyon Road to the Granite Canyon Trailhead. Other roads are also closed. Check with the Chief Ranger for access.</p>
