

Celebrate Hamilton

Saturday, July 11

Alexander Hamilton's home, today known as the Hamilton Grange National Memorial, will host special programming throughout the day. In addition to tours, film showings, and exhibits, there will be several presentations:

10:30 AM and 2:00 PM: "Creating the Coast Guard" by Nicole Scholet AHA Society Vice-President Nicole Scholet presents about Alexander Hamilton's involvement in the creation of the predecessor to the Coast Guard, which celebrates its 225th anniversary this year.

12:00 PM: Presentation on US Dueling Culture
Rangers from the National Park Service present on the history of dueling and the role it played in the US in the 18th century.

1:00 PM: "Introducing New Alexander Hamilton Discoveries" New discoveries that have been made by author Michael E. Newton about Alexander Hamilton's life will be presented.
