Hamilton Grange National Memorial, located in St. Nicholas Park on 141st Street between St. Nicholas and Convent avenues, is open 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Wednesday through Sunday. The visitor center (bookstore, exhibits, restrooms) is open 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Visitation to the historically furnished floor is limited to 15 people at any time. Ranger-led and self-guided options are available.
