On Saturday January 10th at 10:30AM and 1:00PM
a talk will be presented entitled
“Hamilton's in Love .” The talk is 30 minutes in
length, and is comprised of a selection of
readings from some of Hamilton's love letters, with
a short back story to each letter.

At 11:30am National Park Rangers will give a
presentation on “Hamilton’s early life in the
Caribbean”. Hamilton was the only United States
founding father born in the Caribbean.
His experiences as a poor, orphaned youth helped
shape who he was to become.

Additionally, guided tours of the furnished rooms
will be given at 10am, 11am, 2pm and 4pm.

Hamilton Grange National Memorial, located in
St. Nicholas Park on 141st Street between St.
Nicholas and Convent avenues, is open 9 a.m.
to 5 p.m. Wednesday through Sunday.

The visitor center (bookstore, exhibits, re-
strooms) is open 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Visitation to
the historically furnished floor is limited to 15
visitors at any time. Ranger-led and self-guided
options are scheduled daily.
