



ADDENDUM FOR ASTRONOMY TOURS HALEAKALĀ NATIONAL PARK

I. In- Park CUA Holder

- Holder may advertise their program within their designated activity area. Advertisement shall not exceed 28 inches by 36 inches
- Activity must originate and solely occur within the boundaries of the national park area.
- All gross receipts (collected both inside and outside the park) must be reported annually and cannot exceed \$25,000.
- Activities shall not block/hinder traffic flow, throughways (trail or sidewalk), and handicap accessible routes, within buildings or near building entrances/exit areas.
- Equipment used in activity must not create a safety hazard and should be marked or illuminated during non- daylight hours.

II. Out- of- Park CUA Holder

- May not advertise their programs within the park
- Is responsible for completing an Annual Report including gross annual receipts.
- Activities shall not block/hinder traffic flow, throughways (trail or sidewalk), and handicap accessible routes, within buildings or near building entrances/exit areas.
- Equipment used in activity must not create a safety hazard and should be marked or illuminated during non- daylight hours.

III. Conduct of the Tour—Nighttime

- Activities of the CUA holder for night activities will be restricted to the paved areas. If needed, in order to reduce the potential for visitor use conflicts, the activity may utilize the paved parking lot, not to exceed three adjacent parking stalls, provided that they are not cordoned off or needed for other visitor parking. CUA Holder activities are to take place in concert with other visitor uses and Holder understands that they do not have exclusive use of any area.
- During times of inclement weather or other closures of the summit area, Holder will move activities to a location outside the park.

IV. Conduct of the Tour—Solar Astronomy (Will be notated on permit)

- Activities of the CUA holder for Solar Astronomy activities will be restricted to the following areas:
 1. Commercial stalls at Haleakalā Visitor Center. The vehicle must be parked in one of the three stalls closest to the restrooms. Equipment may be placed in the cross-hatched area at the discretion of the CUA holder.
 2. Either end parking stall of the “Sliding Sands Trailhead” parking area (along road to summit). Holder may utilize the sidewalk area in front of the vehicle.
 3. Pu`u Ula`ula (Red Hill): Park the vehicle in the stall adjacent to the cross-hatched zone near the stairs and utilize the cross-hatched zone for equipment OR use the impact “triangle area” where the unpaved trail veers off from the paved trail.
 4. Other parking areas may be considered if Holder provides a written proposal of the proposed area; the site is visited by the Holder and the Revenue & Fee Business Manager, and is approved in writing by the park.
