BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

MS 002

John Ridgely, III (1911-1990) was the eldest son of Louise Roman Humrichouse (1883-1934) and John Ridgely, Jr. (1882-1959). He was born May 11, 1911, in his father's house, Windy Knoll, at 508 Hampton Lane, which was then a part of the Hampton Estate. He and his siblings, J. Walker H. Ridgely (1915-1976) and Louis Roman Ridgely (1920-1998), spent their childhoods between Windy Knoll and their grandfather's house at Hampton. John Ridgely, III, graduated from the Gilman School in Baltimore, after which he spent several years working in New York, where he met his future wife, Lillian M. Ketcham.

Lillian Mary Ketcham (1908-1996) was born in Norwalk, Connecticut, the only child of Anna Mae Higgins (1887-1947) and Bertrand Olmstead Ketcham (1883-1908). Her father died the year she was born, and her mother remarried Frank B. Fields. She graduated from Norwalk High School in 1925 and pursued a degree in nursing in New York. Lillian Ketcham received her nursing diploma in 1929 and was licensed as a Registered Nurse by the State of New York in 1931. She remained in New York studying for a master's degree and it was there she met John Ridgely, III. They were married at St. Patrick's Cathedral on St. Patrick's Day, March 16, 1935.

After their marriage, John and Lillian Ridgely settled in Baltimore, where John Ridgely began working in the printing industry. In 1936, the couple moved into the Hampton mansion with John Ridgely's father, John Ridgely, Jr., who had been widowed in 1934, and grandfather, John Ridgely of Hampton, known as Captain John Ridgely (1851-1938). Lillian Ridgely served briefly as mistress of Hampton for these three generations of Ridgely men, being responsible for practical management of the household and the estate's formal gardens, both of which had suffered since the death of Captain Ridgely's wife, Helen W. S. Ridgely (1854-1929). Lillian Ridgely was a knowledgeable horticulturist and she worked diligently to restore the Hampton gardens, replanting much of the parterres herself. She also maintained the records of the Hampton Farm Dairy, which was an active industry at Hampton during that period.

Captain John Ridgely died in 1938, and in 1940, John Ridgely, Jr., married Jane Hartman Rodney (1902-1978). At that time, John and Lillian Ridgely moved from Hampton mansion to the Hampton Farm House, a late 18th-century structure on the estate that had served chiefly as a farm overseer's or tenant farmer's residence. Plumbing, electricity and other modern amenities had been installed in the Farm House in the early 20th century, but John and Lillian Ridgely were the first Ridgely family members to occupy that house for several generations. They left it in 1942, when both of them joined the armed forces to serve in the war effort.

John Ridgely, III, served in the Pacific Theatre during World War II as a Technical Sergeant in the Army Air Corps. He traveled from island to island during the New Guinea Campaign, beginning in New Guinea in 1943 and spending the last months of his active duty, from August to December 1945, in occupied Japan. As a member of the 60th Depot Supply Squadron, John Ridgely, III, was awarded battle honors in 1945 for his participation in the Pacific campaign. He received an Honorable Discharge in January 1946, but returned to service in the Air Force Reserves from 1949 to 1952. Lillian Ridgely joined the Army Nurse Corps in 1942 and was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant, later attaining the rank of 1st Lieutenant. She treated wounded

soldiers and airmen at Regional Hospital Station at Kessler Field, Biloxi, Mississippi, from 1943 to 1946, earning a meritorious service ribbon.

John and Lillian Ridgely returned to Baltimore after the war, where they built a house, Spring Hollow, at 710 Hampton Lane on a portion of the Hampton Farm Property. John Ridgely, III, resumed working in the printing business for Arthur Thompson and Company, from which he retired about 1980. Lillian Ridgely pursued her avocation, horticulture. She was a charter member of the Town and Country Garden Club and very active in other local and regional garden club activities as well. In addition, she became a highly-respected wildflower photographer, exhibiting her photographs and giving lectures around the country. In the late 1950s, she produced a catalog of Maryland flora that became a standard reference guide for environmental preservation groups.

After Hampton became a National Historic Site in 1948, John and Lillian Ridgely strongly supported the Society for the Preservation of Maryland Antiquities (SPMA) and the National Park Service (NPS) in their efforts to preserve the estate and tell its story. Mr. and Mrs. Ridgely donated numerous Ridgely family artifacts to Hampton NHS, identified persons in old photographs, related their memories of life at Hampton, and supported the fundraising and publicity activities undertaken by the SPMA and the friends group that developed later from it, Historic Hampton, Inc, on behalf of Hampton. In 1980, after the death of Jane H. R. Ridgely, John Ridgely, III, and the other heirs of John Ridgely, Jr., sold the Hampton Farm House and surrounding 14 acres with former slave quarters and other farm buildings to the National Park Service to become part of the Hampton National Historic Site.

The couple had no children. John Ridgely, III, died in 1990, and Lillian K. Ridgely died in 1996.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The papers in the John (III) and Lillian Ketcham Ridgely collection span approximately 170 years, from about 1825 to 1990. The materials consist of personal and business correspondence, autograph books, genealogical information, newspaper clippings, legal and financial documents, military service records, educational documents, will and estate probate papers, World War II souvenirs, and assorted memorabilia. The bulk of the material concentrates on the years from 1880 to 1945, and again from 1970 to 1980. Because this collection supplements in many ways the Ridgely Family Papers (MS 001), the materials have been arranged in keeping with the organizational scheme of that earlier collection, specifically, within the framework of ten series by type of material (discussed in more detail in the series descriptions).

The papers include an eclectic mix of personal, family and business materials. Though only a small number of the items were authored or created by either John or Lillian Ridgely, the types of materials they collected and saved give a broad overview of their lives and reflect their interests and experiences. John Ridgely's stamp collecting hobby produced two stamp albums, various collector sheets and stamp show display cards, and a great number of loose stamps, both U.S. and foreign. The dates of these materials indicate that he pursued his hobby avidly during his youth and early adulthood, but much more sporadically after 1940. Both John and Lillian Ridgely served in the armed forces during World War II and they saved official documents, photographs and memorabilia from their service. In particular, John Ridgely, III, preserved American propaganda leaflets, Army-issued language and cultural instruction materials, postcards, small art works and other items he gathered during his service in the Pacific and occupied Japan from 1943 to 1945. The couple's keen interest in their family histories and the history of Hampton are evident in the genealogical information and historical materials they collected, much of it coming from Helen W. S. Ridgely's earlier research and writing about Hampton and the Ridgelys. The Ridgelys followed Hampton's development as a national park after it passed to the federal government in 1948, but they became more involved in both the daily activities and long-term preservation of Hampton National Historic Site in the late 1970s and 1980s, and correspondence and documents in the collection evidence their vital role in transferring the Hampton Farm Property and many Ridgely family papers and artifacts to the NPS.

Taken in conjunction with the Ridgely Family Papers held by Hampton NHS, the John (III) and Lillian Ketcham Ridgely Collection provides a richer and more detailed picture of life at Hampton during the early 20th century and the lives of the last Ridgelys to live at the family home, as well as the transformation of the estate into a National Historic Site.

SERIES DESCRIPTIONS

MS 002

Series I: Business and Legal (1878-1965, *passim*; 4 folders):

The materials in this series include business correspondence and miscellaneous business documents. Hampton-related correspondence involves real estate matters. Several tax and property-related documents concerning Hampton Company development activities are also included. Correspondence precedes Hampton Company material and items are filed chronologically within each file.

Series II: Estate Management (1910-1981, with the bulk 1967-1981; 4 folders):

The materials in this series primarily focus on activities at Hampton after it became a National Historic Site in 1948, with the exception of some earlier information about the Hampton burial vault. Both correspondence and documents offer information on the transfer of Ridgely family artifacts to Hampton NHS in the 1950s, 1960s and 1970s; the sale of the Hampton farm property to the National Park Service (NPS) in 1980, and the transfer in 1980 of responsibility for daily operations and maintenance of the site from the Society for the Preservation of Maryland Antiquities (SPMA) to the NPS. Materials are grouped by subject and filed chronologically within each category.

Series III: Genealogy (1895-1960, *passim*; 3 folders.):

The materials in this series reflect the keen interest of Ridgely family members in their genealogy and family history. Included are information on the Ridgely family's lineage and coat of arms and materials on the history of the Stewart and Ketcham families in America. Materials are arranged alphabetically by family group and chronologically within each group as necessary.

Series IV: Journals, Diaries and Scrapbooks (1890-1990, *passim*; 3 folders):

This series consists of three items: autograph books compiled by Helen W.S. Ridgely and Lillian K. Ridgely, and the Memorial Book from the funeral service for John Ridgely, III. The items are arranged chronologically.

Series V: Newspapers (1880-1900, 1948; 2 folders):

This series contains newspaper clippings preserved by Ridgely and/or related family members, including articles about Hampton's history and its transfer from the Ridgely family to the National Park Service, assorted poems and an item concerning Lillian K. Ridgely's horticulture activities. Materials are arranged alphabetically by subject.

Series VI: Personal Correspondence (1825-1985, with the bulk 1880-1930; Approx. .5 lin. ft.):

This series contains an eclectic mix of the personal correspondence of assorted Ridgely family members and many of their relations. In addition to letters, the series includes unmatched envelopes and postcards. Only a few letters authored by John Ridgely, III, or his wife, Lillian K. Ridgely have survived; most items pertain to Ridgely and Ketcham family ancestors, especially Helen W.S. Ridgely, grandmother of John Ridgely, III, and David Stewart IV, great-uncle of John Ridgely, III. One or two individual items are of general historical interest, such as a brief 1845 letter from Daniel Webster to his law partner, Joseph W. Moulton, the great-great-grandfather of John Ridgely, III. However, the collection as a whole is valuable for its documentation of the activities, travels and personal relationships of the Ridgely, Field, Humrichouse, Moulton, Stewart and other authors. Many postcards and empty envelopes were most likely saved by John Ridgely, III (or by others for him) for the stamps attached to them. Materials are grouped under the headings of Correspondence, Envelopes and Postcards. Correspondence and Envelopes are arranged alphabetically by family group/individual author (last name/first name) and chronologically therein, with incoming correspondence first and outgoing correspondence following. Please note that the correspondence of the daughters of the Ridgely masters of Hampton is located under "Ridgely" whether or not the authors' names changed later as a result of marriage.

Series VII: Personal Papers (1850-1990, with the bulk 1925-1955; Approx. .5 lin. ft.):

This series contains family members' personal records (e.g., educational documents, identification documents, military service records, etc.), poems, notes and miscellaneous writings authored and/or collected by various individuals. Documentation of Lillian K. Ridgely's nursing education and training and the military records of both John and Lillian Ridgely comprise the bulk of this series and attest to their actions and duties during World War II. The materials are arranged chronologically under the following headings: Educational Documents, Identification Documents, Military Service Records, Personal Writings, and Collected Writings.

Series VIII: Stamp Collection (1855-1985, with the bulk 1880-1940; Approx. 3 lin. ft.):

This series documents John Ridgely's activities as a stamp collector. The materials include correspondence, stamp albums (both home-made and published) and collector sheets, and a wide variety of individual stamps, both U.S. and foreign, standard postage and special issues. Larger items are arranged chronologically under the general headings of Correspondence, Revenue/Tax Stamps (U.S. and foreign), Stamp Albums and Collector Sheets, and Loose Stamps. Loose Stamps are organized alphabetically by country (with U.S. stamps first), then numerically by stamp face value and chronologically by estimated date of issue. Please note that the stamp albums and collector sheets often contain loose pages or stamps and require careful handling.

Series IX: Wills and Estate Papers (1938-1978, *passim*; 4 folders):

This series contains a photocopy of a will, correspondence, and estate probate documents. These materials primarily address the settlement of the estate of John Ridgely, Jr., father of John Ridgely, III, especially after the death of Mr. Ridgely's widow, Jane H.R. Ridgely, in 1978. Topics covered include the sale of the Hampton farm property and transfer of various Ridgely family artifacts to Hampton NHS under the terms of Mr. Ridgely's will and that of J. Walker H. Ridgely, brother of John Ridgely, III. Materials are arranged chronologically within the categories of Wills; Administration Accounts; Appraisals and Correspondence.

Series X: Memorabilia (1865-1965, with the bulk 1910-1945; Approx. .5 lin. ft.):

Materials in this series include postcards, school and church programs, religious mementoes (including biological matter), World War II souvenirs, and miscellaneous notes and lists. Many postcards (never mailed) contain handwritten notes documenting the travels of various Ridgelys and related family members. Of particular interest are souvenirs collected by John Ridgely, III, during his World War II military service in the Pacific Theatre and Occupied Japan. Like materials are grouped together (e.g., notes, postcards, etc.) and are arranged chronologically where possible.
