Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park is home to numerous endangered plants and animals. On Tuesday, Wildlife Biologist Kathleen Misajon will highlight two endangered bird species, the iconic nēnē (Hawaiian goose), and the more mysterious 'ua'u (Hawaiian petrel). Learn more about these species and the park's efforts to monitor and protect them. On Saturday, become a park steward and join park staff in removing large mats of knotweed (*Polygonum*) and other invasive plants around the Devastation Trail area — an important habitat for nēnē.
