## **Description:**

Records created by Thomas Boles, Jr., first Superintendent at Hawaii National Park from 1922 to 1926. In 1921, at the age of 40, Boles applied for the job of Superintendent at Hot Springs National Park in Arkansas, but the National Park Service felt that his civil engineering expertise better qualified him as the Superintendent of Hawaii National Park. After a five year assignment in Hawaii, he joined the Pacific Electric Railway in Los Angeles in 1926. In Los Angeles, Boles met Horace Albright, the deputy director of the National Park Service, who told him about a job opening as Superintendent of Carlsbad Cave National Monument in New Mexico, now Carlsbad Caverns National Park. He started there in April 1927 and worked to 1946, when Boles left Carlsbad Caverns for a position at Hot Springs National Park. Boles retired from the National Park Service in 1951.

Thomas Boles Jr. (1881-1973) married Inez J. "Jimmie" Green (1892-1962) and had one child, Margaret (1917-1993).

This collection originated in the Carlsbad Caverns National Park Museum Collection and was transferred to Hawaii Volcanoes National Park in 2016. It was consequently accessioned in 2017 and cataloged in 2021.

#### **Acquisition:**

Collection originated at Carlsbad Caverns National Park (CAVE) in 2009. CAVE received the collection from James McGuire, a grandson of Thomas Boles, on April 16, 2009. In 2016, CAVE transferred the collection to HAVO. HAVO accessioned the collection in 2017 and cataloged it in 2021.

#### **Processing:**

This collection was processed and cataloged by Coquelicot Shirey on 2/25/2021.

#### Arrangement:

This collection is organized into five series by format: Series I: Scrapbook; Series II: Prints; Series III: Stereoscopic Prints; Series IV: Negatives; Series V: Ephemera.

After format, items in these series are organized by size, when applicable. Otherwise, items were kept in original order as they were received.

This collection was not cataloged beyond the Series Level, as the File Unit Level does not work for the organization of the collection and the Item Level is a separate directory in ICMS not used by any other archival collection at this park. Museum staff worried that information cataloged at the Item Level would be lost during ICMS transfers or would not be utilized since no other collection uses the Item Level in ICMS.

#### History

Records created by Thomas Boles, Jr., first Superintendent at Hawaii National Park from 1922 to 1926. In 1921, at the age of 40, Boles applied for the job of Superintendent at Hot Springs National Park in Arkansas, but the National Park Service felt that his civil engineering expertise better qualified him as the Superintendent of Hawaii National Park. After a five year assignment in Hawaii, he joined the Pacific Electric Railway in Los Angeles in 1926. In Los Angeles, Boles met Horace Albright, the deputy director of the National Park Service, who told him about a job opening as Superintendent of Carlsbad Cave National Monument in New Mexico, now Carlsbad Caverns National Park. He started there in April 1927 and worked to 1946, when Boles left Carlsbad Caverns for a position at Hot Springs National Park. Boles retired from the National Park Service in 1951.

Thomas Boles Jr. (1881-1973) married Inez J. "Jimmie" Green (1892-1962) and had one child, Margaret (1917-1993).

This collection originated in the Carlsbad Caverns National Park Museum Collection and was transferred to Hawaii Volcanoes National Park in 2016. It was consequently accessioned in 2017 and cataloged in 2021.

Historical Note: The S.S. Haleakala was an inter-island steamship that served Oahu, Maui, and Hawaii Islands. The steamer was built in 1922 and served as an interisland steamship until World War II, when it was acquired by the Navy in 1941. It eventually turned into a troop transport ship, USAT Haleakala. The S.S. Haleakala is photographed multiple times throughout this collection.

#### Scope

This collection includes photographic prints, stereoscopic prints, photographic postcards, printed postcards, nitrate negatives, a scrapbook, an architectural linen, personal correspondence, newspaper clippings, and otherephemera relating to Thomas Boles and his family's residence in Hawaii National Park from 1922 to 1926. Prints are snapshots of the Boles family and friends in Hawaii National Park, which includes modern-day Hawaii Volcanoes National Park and Haleakala National Park, or are landscapes of the two parks.

Five (5) binder boxes of photographic prints and ephemera; one (1) scrapbook containing 53 prints; one (1) shoebox of stereoscopes; five (5) folders of oversized materials; and one (1) bag of nitrate negatives.

552 EA prints, 10 EA ephemera, 1 scrapbook with prints (53 EA), 20 EA stereoscopes, 1 EA linen, 7 EA newspaper clippings, 49 EA negatives.
