Every year, millions of people visit National Parks to vacation and learn about the history of our country. You will go on a Quest to discover for yourself how special these national parks are. You will be using this WebQuest worksheet to visit different web sites of the National Park Service and to record your answers. Once your WebQuest is complete, you will be awarded a certificate to go on your very own Quest at Hopewell Culture National Historical Park!

Begin your QUEST by visiting the National Park Service website www.nps.gov and answer the following questions.

Click-on the **About Us** and then click the **Frequently Asked Questions** link near the bottom of the page.

1. How many National Park Service Sites are there?
2. What is the official emblem of the National Park Service (this is the last question on the Frequently Asked Questions page)?
3. Pick three different National Park Service Sites (this includes national battlefields, national monuments, recreation areas, etc.) and list one reason why they are being protected.

Select the **Find a Park** link and look at the state of Ohio.

4. How many National Park Service Sites are in Ohio?
5. Which National Park Service Site in Ohio is located closest to your school, and what does it preserve?

6. Why is Hopewell Culture National Historical Park a National Park? What is it preserving and protecting?

7. What are these American Indians known for constructing?

8. On the left menu tab select **History and Culture** and then **Places**. The menu will display a list of all five of the earthwork's Hopewell Culture NHP protects: Hopewell Mound Group, Hopeton Earthworks, Mound City Group and Seip Earthworks. Select two, write their names below and at least one fact about each.

9. Go to www.museum.nps.gov. Select the **Park** tab and choose **by name**. Select **H** from the alphabet list and then **Hopewell Culture**. On the bottom right-hand corner select **Prehistoric**. 
