

Please Remember

- Foot travel on all trails - no motorized vehicles.

Hike Safely

Wear clothing & footwear appropriate for season & terrain.

Ticks which can spread Lyme Disease are common here. Avoid brushing against vegetation, use insect repellent.

Poison-ivy is common along the trail.

Drinking water is not available along the trail- be sure to bring your own.

Trail Descriptions

The blue-blazed Cove Trail starts at the Trailhead and leads you downhill past the Ice Pond, ending at a large freshwater tidal marsh Do not pass gate onto railroad track - very hazardous.

The yellow Meadow Trail leads through forest and along the edge of the meadow, with excellent views of the FDR Home.

The green Forest Trail makes a 1.75 mile round trip from its starting point along the Cove Trail. This has very steep sections. If you bear right at the fork, you will walk under a white pine plantation planted by FDR in 1935.

The Hyde Park Trail, marked with Tulip-tree markers, passes through the site using the Cove and Forest Trails.

From all trails, it is a steep uphill walk back to the park visitor center.
