As participants in this program, students will experience empowerment through interactive workshops, leadership training, and service projects. Expense-paid field trips to other national parks and related sites will also be part of the program. Students will be considered volunteers at Homestead National Monument of America and will be required to submit a completed volunteer agreement form. Students will be able to count their time in Homestead National Monument Youth Council towards any required volunteer hours.

Purpose:

The purpose of Homestead National Monument Council is to develop student leaders, raise consciousness in communities, and encourage creativity in education. Through the Homestead National Monument Youth Council program youth will be empowered to become agents of change and public servants within the National Park Service, and in their local communities.

Vision:

Students will be empowered to become active leaders and advocates of change in their communities. Students will gain an understanding and appreciation for the range, significance, and purpose of the National Park Service, and be among a diverse group of students who will be informed about future career possibilities in the NPS.

Selection Criteria:

The Selection Committee will objectively evaluate each applicant's leadership potential, engagement with community, and interests in the National Park Service. We anticipate selecting between eight to twelve participants. Students will be notified of their selection for Homestead National Monument Youth Council no later than September 19, 2018.

Preferential consideration will be given to current high school juniors and seniors and those students that recommend other students to apply.

- 1. I understand that regular attendance at monthly meetings and Homestead National Monument Youth Council field trips/special events is required. The first meeting will be Saturday, October 6, 2018. The final meeting for the school year will be Saturday, May 18, 2019. Most meetings will run from 9:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Field trip days may start earlier and last longer.
- 2. It is my responsibility to inform park staff of my absence or withdrawal from the program. Students are afforded two absences from Homestead National Monument Youth Council meetings. More than two absences may result in removal from the program.

- 3. I understand it is my responsibility to secure my own transportation to and from meetings. All Homestead National Monument Youth Council meetings will begin at the Homestead National Monument Education Center located at 8523 West State Highway 4, Beatrice, NE 68310. Transportation to all field trips will be provided by Homestead National Monument.
- 4. I understand that there are all-day field trips and in-park service projects which participants will be expected to attend and participate. Expenses related to these trips and projects will be paid by the Homestead National Monument Youth Council program and not the participants.
- 5. I understand that a signed volunteer agreement form and a photo release form must be submitted if I am selected. If I am under 18 years of age, both forms will also need to be signed by my parent/guardian.
- 6. I understand that during each meeting, field trip, retreat, special event, or at other functions, I will be required to act in a dignified and respectful manner, particularly towards persons involved in the program. I also understand being a Homestead National Monument Youth Council participant may mean that I am exposed to people, ideas, or environments that are unfamiliar to me. I therefore agree to conduct myself in a professional and appropriate manner consistent with someone in a leadership role. I understand that my failure to do so may result in my removal from the Homestead National Monument Youth Council program.
- 7. I affirm that my involvement in the Homestead National Monument Youth Council is the beginning (or confirmation) of my active and ongoing participation with the National Park Service, community organizations and volunteer efforts.
