Honouliuli National Historic Site Welcomes Your Input

The National Park Service (NPS) is beginning work on a new general management plan at Honouliuli National Historic Site. The plan will provide broad direction for management across the entire park.

About the Park

Honouliuli National Historic Site once housed over 4,000 prisoners of war and 400 American civilians in the largest and longest-used World War II incarceration camp in the Hawaiian Islands. The National Park Service aims to preserve the legacy of the camp through its history and stories of the people imprisoned, and inspire reflection on wartime experiences and the need to protect civil liberties in times of conflict.

About the General Management Plan

General management plans are required by law for every unit of the national park system per the National Parks and Recreation Act of 1978. These plans provide high-level direction for park managers and help guide decisions about preserving cultural and natural resources, developing the infrastructure needed to support visitor use, and determining appropriate levels of visitor use and park boundaries.



Planning Timeline

The general management plan is a multi-year process. Throughout this process we want to hear from you, the community, to help inform the plan. You will have several opportunities to provide your thoughts during this process. Below are important steps in the planning process and anticipated timelines for completion.*

1

Spring 2025

NPS team begins identifying initial concepts based on prior engagement

2

Early 2026

Host public meetings to discuss early planning concepts/feedback

3

2026 - 2027

NPS team writes the first draft of the plan

4

Summer 2027

Host public meetings to discuss the draft plan/receive feedback

5

Early 2028

Finalize the plan
